**SUBJECT: Issues Update**

The following are issues related to the City for the weekly Issues Update. If there are additional items you believe should be included, please let me know.

**Ebola Preparation**

Representatives from the Peoria Police Department, Peoria Fire Department and other community agency partners attended a meeting at the Peoria County Health Department on Wednesday, October 22, 2014. The group met to discuss plans and protocols in place and that are currently being developed should the current national concerns regarding the Ebola virus become a reality for the Peoria area. Health Department and hospital representatives discussed plans in place to handle the situation should it arise. Discussions included triage, points of entry, designated isolation areas, personal protective equipment, contact tracing, waste disposal and environmental disinfection.

Definitions and the explanation of the differences between "isolation" and "quarantine" were given so that participating parties would have a better understanding when the terms are used. Someone who is placed in "isolation" has been shown to be positive for the virus. Someone who is not positive but had contact, etc. is placed in "quarantine." Usually, this is done voluntarily, but statute gives the Health Department the authority to issue orders of isolation and quarantine. These would be issued locally by Greg Chance, Peoria County Public Health Administrator. It can be issued verbally, written, or with court authorization. The issue for Police is that law enforcement is tasked with enforcing the order. The Peoria County States Attorney's Office representative is going to research what level of force is considered allowable for law enforcement should that situation arise, and will inform the Police Department.

Information was provided that anyone wanting to see most recent updates on the Ebola virus situation can go to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) website or visit the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) website which also has a referral button to the CDC site.

**2014/2015 Exterior Paint Program**

On October 14, 2014, the City Council approved Sherwin Williams as the paint supplier for the 2014/2015 Exterior Paint Program open to homeowners in the 1<sup>st</sup> Council District. Applications are currently being accepted; however, distribution of paint vouchers may be delayed pending weather appropriate painting conditions. ### **Premise Alert Program**

In response to low sign-up numbers, the Mayor's Advisory Committee for the Disabled (MACD) has begun a mail campaign to help promote the use of the Illinois Premise Alert Program (Public Act 96-0788). A letter and 25 copies of the City of Peoria's enrollment application have been sent to the following organizations: Advocates for Access, Central Illinois Agency of Aging, EPIC, Peoria Area Blind Center, Peoria Housing Authority and Peoria Public Library. Each organization was asked to encourage their clients with functional or access needs to enroll in the program.

Through this voluntary program, people with functional or access needs can provide information to Police, Fire and EMS personnel to be kept in a confidential database. This information can then be provided to first responders dealing with a situation involving an individual or individuals with special needs. Since every second counts when responding to a call, having this critical information before arriving on the scene could make a huge difference.

# Exterior Paint Program

The City of Peoria is providing paint vouchers for homeowners in the 1st Council District to re-paint the exterior of their home. Vouchers will be distributed on a first come, first serve basis. Call today to request an application!

## Program Requirements:

- Property must be owner occupied. (No rental or contract for deed properties.)
- Property must be single family residential.
- Property taxes must be current.
- Property must be within 1st Council District.
- No income eligibility requirements.
- Homeowner must provide proof of property insurance.
- The City will **only** provide paint. (Homeowner must provide labor, painting materials, and other items to complete the project.)
- Up to 20 gallons of exterior paint is available per property in 5 gallon increments. Upon completion of each 5 gallons, the city will inspect.
