SUBJECT: Issues Update

The following are issues related to the City for the weekly Issues Update. If there are additional items you believe should be included, please let me know.

Gateway Building Caterers

In 2013, City Council approved a process to provide additional catering opportunities to local caterers that met the City and Park District qualifications for catering services. To date, three new caterers have been added to the Gateway Building catering services list in addition to the three original contracted caterers. The new caterers are Cracked Pepper, Hickory River Smokehouse and Biaggi's. The existing contract caterers are Barrack's Cater Inn, Chef's Catering and Childers Catering. The existing caterer contracts will expire June 31, 2014, and they are now re-registering through the new catering process in order to streamline the selection and management of caterers. All caterers are required to pay an annual fee of \$300 due by June 30th of each year, pay 16% of gross food and beverage sales, must not be in arrears of any sales tax, property tax, and license fees, provide \$1,000,000 of general liability insurance, and keep current their food license, liquor license, and Equal Employment Opportunity Certification.

EDC Central Illinois Supply Chain Diversification Study

The Economic Development Council (EDC) received a planning grant through the Economic Development Administration (EDA) to develop a Central Illinois Supply Chain Diversification Study. The study examines manufacturing trends in the Central Illinois region comprised of Logan, Mason, Peoria, Tazewell and Woodford Counties. Preliminary findings are attached for review. The full study will be completed in September 2014. Some noted findings from the study include:

- Manufacturing accounts for nearly \$6.7 billion in Central Illinois Gross Regional Product (GRP).
- Construction machinery manufacturing accounts for 43% of manufacturing employment, making it the largest manufacturing industry employer in the region.
- Since 2009, the manufacturing occupations in Central Illinois that have seen the greatest growth are mechanical engineers, machinists; and team assemblers.
- There is a growing projected need for machinists, computer-controlled machine operators, welders, cutter, solderers, and brazers.





Regional Employment and Unemployment Rates (2004-2013)




- Regional employment was just under 190,000 in 2013, its lowest level since 2004.



For the Year Ended December 31, 2013**

NOTE 1 - BASIS OF EXAMINATION AND SIGNIFICANT POLICIES

Advanced Medical Transport, Inc. (Organization) is an Illinois not for profit, tax exempt corporation organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, and educational purposes in furtherance of, and to carry out, the purposes of Peoria Hospitals' Mobile Medical Services, an Illinois not for profit corporation. The Organization has entered into an agreement with the City of Peoria for a nonexclusive franchise right to provide ambulance service in the City of Peoria. The Organization's agreement with the City of Peoria calls for the Organization to meet certain time standards for emergency responses.

Per the City of Peoria agreement, at least 90 percent of all response times for life-threatening Priority 1 emergencies shall meet the requirements of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1710 "Emergency Medical Operations". This standard allowed up to ten minutes for the Organization to reach the scene of the call after notification of the call was received.

Per the City of Peoria agreement, 90 percent of all other non life-threatening Priority responses (titled Priority 2 by the Organization) shall meet a standard of twelve minutes for the above procedures.
