**Street Naming for “Big John” Robinson**



On Wednesday, September 23, the corner of Kumpf and Martin Luther King Boulevards was renamed “Big John” Robinson Way. In 1950, “Big John” Robinson and his wife Mary opened John’s Bar-B-Q in a small house on the 700 block of Monson Street, now Kumpf Boulevard. “Big John” was known for his work ethic, business savvy and his signature line: “Y’all have enough to eat?” Known as Peoria’s first Black Millionaire, Mr. Robinson was th recipient of accolades and awards throughout his historic career. Not only was he a front page feature on the Chicago Tribune, but he was also interviewed by Paul Harvey. Known for his philanthropic nature, Mr. Robinson employed over 20 employees for over 40 years.

### **PSD 150 – Update from Interim Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**



Last week, Illinois released [statewide scores](#) from the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Career (PARCC). PARCC made its debut last spring and replaced the ISAT as the required state assessment.

PARCC results from the 2014-15 school year suggest that only 37% of Illinois 4th graders are reading proficiently and only 31% of

Illinois 8th graders are proficient at math. Even for a baseline year, that's not good news.

Peoria parents, just like every Illinois parent want their child to be prepared to succeed in life after high school whether they go to college or directly into the workforce. Yet, thousands of Illinois jobs, from Peoria to Chicago to St. Louis are going unfilled because employers cannot find qualified candidates.

The long-term health and strength of our state depends on having an education system that prepares graduates for civic engagement and the job market. In 2010, Illinois revamped its learning standards for math and English Language Arts to better prepare students for college and careers. With new standards

came the need for a new tool to measure student progress against grade-level goals and standards for college and career readiness.

This new assessment focuses not just on content but also real-world skills such as critical thinking, communication and creativity. Because it is a new test measuring new learning standards, this year's results should not be used as a comparison to past performance. And although we know this is a baseline year, it shouldn't prevent us from taking seriously the task ahead.


While Illinois educators led the way in developing this new test, it was given in 11 states last spring. This means that for the first time, there is a common measurement of student achievement so that we can benchmark our students' progress against children in other states. If our students are behind, we'll know it; and we have the potential to improve by learning from the successes of other PARCC states. And they can learn from us.

The future of economic growth in Peoria and the tri-county area is contingent on our ability, as educators, business and civic leaders to partner with each other to support school improvement initiatives. The tri-county area has the responsibility of providing all students with real-world rigorous and relevant education. The local results on the PARCC exam will not be available for another month. We know that scores in our area are likely to tell us a similar story to the state results.

It is true that transitions can be difficult. But these numbers are most certainly a call to action. Tweaking what we have will not suffice. We have recently made important changes to leadership in our education system in D150. But it will take more than just that new leadership. We must come together as a community, and agree to participate and collaborate at an extraordinary level to change these numbers in a very big way. Other communities have already begun doing so.

I hope you will join us and our community in the education of our 13,000 students. Share your ideas for our District with your Principal, me or a Board of Education Member. Become a Reading Buddy, a mentor or a tutor. Join the PTO. Attend Parent University each month. Ask your workplace or organization to consider becoming an Adopt-A-School partner to a District 150 school. ## Message from Director Michael Rogers

Because of the upcoming U.S. EPA Federal mandate issue for Peoria to reduce the amount of overflow from the combined storm water & sanitary sewer systems (CSO), the City of Peoria has proposed using green infrastructure programs! Green infrastructure programs include community gardens and rain gardens, pervious pavers, and native landscaping, to name a few. Green infrastructure not only reduces storm water runoff, but can also provide additional community benefits.

Instead of just fixing a problem with green infrastructure, we are also working toward a Work Force program, and various other economic development ideas to give our community a boost.

The team has made several trips to cities that have been in similar situations like ours. Trips to Buffalo and Philadelphia have given our Public Works team different ideas about how others solved the problem in their City. Buffalo has laid out a sustainability plan using best practices for their City. Philadelphia looks at creating and training a work force to maintain the green infrastructure. Peoria is considering how we can take some of these ideas and implement them into our Green Plan.

On Friday, October 2, from 12:00 pm to 2:00 pm, at the Peoria Riverfront Museum, the City is hosting a Global City Network event with experts from around the nation meeting in Peoria to discuss wet weather situations. This event will focus on creating co-benefits around green infrastructure for the proposed solution to the CSO issue. The first half of the session will feature two keynote speakers: Chuck Marohn, the founder of Strong Towns and Doug Farr of Farr Associates. The second half of the session will feature experts from across many industries that will provide their expertise about how green infrastructure can be used across the community. Everyone is welcome, so please join us.





# Is it OK to install “Children at play” signs?

Traffic signs are installed on our highways for many reasons. They may inform us of the need to stop, the speed limit, street names or which direction to go. Warning signs alert us to unexpected hazards on our roads. Signs help us obey the laws, find our destination, and keep us from running off the road. They help us to be safe whether we are a motorist, bicyclist or pedestrian.

Many agencies receive requests for “Slow Children,” “Children at Play,” or “Slow Children at Play” signs. At first glance it seems logical to install these signs. After all, children play in or near the road and shouldn’t there be some warning given to drivers? But do they really help? Are these signs ok to use?

The first place to look for advice is the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). This is a federal document that provides guidance on how to use traffic signs and which signs are appropriate. Kentucky law requires the use of this manual for traffic control.

Part 2 of the MUTCD discusses the function and purpose of acceptable signs on all types of roads. Communities are to only use standard signs that are found in the manual. “Children at Play” signs are not listed therefore are nonstandard and inappropriate to install.

There are several reasons why “Children at Play” signs are nonstandard and not to be used on roadways. Here are a few of them:

- The Traffic Control Devices Handbook from the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) states, “Caution-Children at Play or Slow Children Playing signs should not be used since they may encourage children to play in the street and may encourage parents to be less vigilant.” “Children at Play” signs give parents a false sense of security in letting their children play in the street.
- Motorists should expect children to be at play in all residential areas, and the lack of signing on some streets may indicate otherwise.
- These signs have no legal basis for determining what a motorist should do. They are unenforceable and act as another roadside obstacle to pedestrians and errant motorists.

- Use of these nonstandard signs may imply that the involved jurisdiction approves of streets as play grounds, which may result in the jurisdiction being vulnerable to tort liability.
- These signs do not provide guidance to motorists as to a safe speed.
- “Children at Play” signs may be designed to look like warning signs, diamond shaped and yellow with a black legend. However, in many instances, this sign has a nonstandard shape and color. Warning signs provide information on the specific location of the hazard (pedestrian crossing, curve, etc.). “Children at Play” signs do not give a specific location. They merely tell the driver that kids may be in the road somewhere.



- Studies have shown that “Children at Play” signs do not reduce traffic speeds or make drivers more observant. There are some alternatives that can work in many instances. The Playground sign is an appropriate sign alongside parks or playgrounds. Also the pedestrian crossing sign should be used to warn motorists in those locations where children and others frequently cross the road. Nearly 30 percent of tort cases filed against roadway agencies pertain to signs. When installing signs that do not follow the guidelines in the MUTCD, agencies are increasing their liability, should a child be hit on these roadways. It can be difficult to say no to

residents when this sign is requested. Yet, by following the MUTCD and not installing “Children at Play” you may be improving safety for everyone in your community.
