All award winners will be recognized at this year’s Illinois Planning Conference on Thursday, October 8th.



Approximately 30 entrepreneurs from Greater Peoria heard from financial experts, economic development professionals, successful local small business owners and other key partners.

iTEAM-Introduction!



Peoria was one of 12 US cities selected in December 2014 to participate in the \$45 million expansion of the Bloomberg Philanthropies' Innovation Teams program.

What is an Innovation Team?

Innovation teams (i-teams) function as in-house innovation consultants, moving from one community priority to the next. Using Bloomberg Philanthropies' tested Innovation Delivery approach, i-teams help City leaders and staff through a data-driven process to assess problems, generate responsive new

interventions, develop partnerships, and deliver measurable results.

What is the Innovation Team focused on now?

In Peoria, the i-team is initially focusing on the Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) issue. Combined sewers carry both sanitary wastewater and stormwater. When rain or snowmelt overwhelm the system, around 20 to 30 times a year, the combined sewers overflow into the Illinois River. The Environmental Protection Agency has mandated that the City remedy this issue. The i-team is identifying ways for Peoria to leverage the tremendous expense of solving the CSO problem while simultaneously improving the lives of residents in these areas through such means as job creation, sustainability and reinvestment.

PSD 150 – Update from Interim Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

Peoria Public Schools has a strong mission and vision statement in place that guides our work as educators and I believe also allows our community to understand and assist with our role as a school district. Our mission is to ensure that each student reaches his or her full academic and personal potential and is a well-balanced citizen. Our vision is that we take pride in educating and graduating each student prepared and inspired to contribute to the world.

On Monday night, our Board of Education made one large step in reaching what I believe could be one large group of students to, as our mission states, help them “reach their full academic and personal potential.” For the last five years, our District has focused on Advanced Placement (AP) course offerings for our students, an important and impressive offering for students that wish to explore and/or pursue a 4-year college degree.

While our District will continue to push every student to their full academic potential, we know that are students and families want options. There are many considerations on what path a student might consider and pursue, including finances, career preparation and goals, size and environment, and others. Courses offered through the community college is one avenue that can and should be considered. Whether students are looking to get a jump start in high school on career training programs or earn college credit in advance of their post-secondary plans, I am excited that the Board of Education approved an agreement for the Strong Start program offered through Illinois Central College (ICC). We are so eager to get the program started and impact our students’ future, that we will launch a pilot program for eligible students starting second semester this year. Full implementation will begin next school year. Strong Start will allow our seniors to concurrently enroll in our District and at ICC to earn the appropriate college credit towards an Associate Degree, while at the same time fulfill the requirements for high school diploma in our District. The program will allow students to attend their Dual Enrollment courses on ICC’s campus for a partial or full day, and return to the District for any courses at their home high school that are needed for graduation.


Pending sufficient enrollment numbers, Peoria Public Schools currently allows students, during course registration in January, to choose from dual credit courses at their home high school.

Dual Credit offerings at registration, include:

- Art 110,
- CISCO Networking I, II, III, & IV,
- Health Occupations 111 and 114 (Introduction to Interdisciplinary Health Care and Careers),
- Health 120 (First Aid) & Health 121 (Medical Terminology),
- English 110 & 111,
- Spanish 110 & 111,
- Math 110 & 111,
- Biology 140,
- American History 201 & 202, and
- World History 117 & 118

This school year, Peoria Public Schools has 246 students enrolled in 12 Dual Credit classes within the District. With seniors allowed to take classes on the ICC campus, the Strong Start Program will build upon the current course offerings, allowing students to choose from ICC’s entire course catalog.

Equally, if not more important than our offerings is that we want to make sure we provide and prepare students with the skills, growth mindset and academic and social support that will prepare them for post-secondary training and success. Over several years, our District has spent at least \$750,000 training our staff and/or implementing AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) in a dozen of our 27 schools. AVID impacts more than 80,000 students in 44 states and 16 other countries/territories. Its mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society, which I believe fits in beautifully with our District's mission, vision and values.

While we can't afford to continue the spending pattern that has been used to implement AVID, I believe it is an asset for our District and our schools are doing a great job utilizing the resources they are given. When visiting AVID school classrooms, WICOR (Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization and Reading) strategies are being used, students are using planners, learning Cornell note taking and building their school binders, all organization strategies and soft skills that will make students' life in school and their transition to college and career a little easier. Moving forward, we are working on a train-the-trainer model and have staff that are doing exemplary work with AVID that can, with few exceptions, provide training to colleagues across the District without trips out of state.

We must support our students and schools and provide them with a toolbox of resources that will improve our District and allow us to see our students graduate ready for work or college. As a community, we need all hands on deck to make it happen. We have volunteer opportunities to assist our students, including becoming a Reading Buddy to our third grade students, an AVID tutor for our high school students or your business or organization is willing to adopt a school in our District, please contact us to find out more information. Is it OK to install “Children at play” signs?

Traffic signs are installed on our highways for many reasons. They may inform us of the need to stop, the speed limit, street names or which direction to go. Warning signs alert us to unexpected hazards on our roads. Signs help us obey the laws, find our destination, and keep us from running off the road. They help us to be safe whether we are a motorist, bicyclist or pedestrian.

Many agencies receive requests for “Slow Children”, “Children at Play”, or “Slow Children at Play” signs. At first glance it seems logical to install these signs. After all, children play in or near the road and shouldn't there be some warning given to drivers? But do they really help? Are these signs ok to use?

The first place to look for advice is the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). This is a federal document that provides guidance on how to use traffic signs and which signs are appropriate. Kentucky law requires the use of this manual for traffic control.

Part 2 of the MUTCD discusses the function and purpose of acceptable signs on all types of roads. Communities are to only use standard signs that are found in the manual. “Children at Play” signs are not listed therefore are nonstandard and inappropriate to install.

There are several reasons why “Children at Play” signs are non-standard and not to be used on roadways. Here are a few of them:

- Use of these nonstandard signs may imply that the involved jurisdiction approves of streets as play-grounds, which may result in the jurisdiction being vulnerable to tort liability.
 - These signs do not provide guidance to motorists as to a safe speed.
 - “Children at Play” signs may be designed to look like warning signs, diamond shaped and yellow with a black legend. However, in many instances, this sign has a nonstandard shape and color. Warning signs provide information on the specific location of the hazard (pedestrian crossing, curve, etc.). “Children at Play” signs do not give a specific location. They merely tell the driver that kids may be in the road somewhere.
 - Studies have shown that “Children at Play” signs do not reduce traffic speeds or make drivers more observant. There are some alternatives that can work in many instances. The playground sign is an appropriate sign alongside parks or playgrounds. Also the pedestrian crossing sign should be used to warn motorists in those locations where children and others frequently cross the road.
- Nearly 30 percent of tort cases filed against roadway agencies pertain to signs. When installing signs that do not follow the guidelines in the MUTCD, agencies are increasing their liability should a child be hit on these roadways. It can be difficult to say no to residents when this sign is requested. Yet, by following the MUTCD and not installing “Children at Play” you may be improving safety for everyone in your community.
