**SUBJECT: Issues Update**

The following are issues related to the City for the weekly Issues Update. If there are additional items you believe should be included, please let me know.

**Pedestrian Safety Upgrade at Hickory Grove Road and Allen Road Roundabout**

Laser Electric is scheduled to install new rapid flashing beacon warning lights for the pedestrian crossings at the Hickory Grove Road and Allen Road roundabout the week of March 16, 2015. The installation of the rapid flashing beacon warning lights will give notification to vehicles entering the roundabout from each direction that a pedestrian is present within the roundabout cross-walk.

The Public Works Department has fielded concerns of the low visibility of the existing warning lights in daylight hours at this roundabout. This roundabout is adjacent to the Hickory Grove Elementary School, which generates many young pedestrians utilizing the roadway crossing systems, and added to the concern for greater pedestrian awareness. The upgrade will bring this pedestrian crossing system to the standard used at other roundabouts within the City. The added visibility of the LED lights will also make the motoring public more aware of these pedestrian crossings.
