

Public Works/#iteam--NEW CITYWIDE PARTY CELEBRATES PEORIA'S IMPROVEMENTS

PEORIA, Ill.—Peoria Public Works and the iTeam are launching the first ever **CityFest**. CityFest is a location-specific party that highlights updated and improved parts of Peoria. Each CityFest will celebrate a different part of the city.

The inaugural **CityFest >> Warehouse** will draw attention to the renewed stretch of Adams Street between Pecan Street and Persimmon Street and marks the conclusion of the City's green infrastructure pilot project.

1. The event is free and open to all. It will be hosted on October 22, 4-8 p.m. on Adams Street, between Pecan and Persimmon (the road will be closed to traffic).
2. Guests can enjoy live music and hear remarks by City leadership.
3. The event will feature an outdoor café and attendees can purchase food and drink from multiple food trucks and a beer tent.

This party honors the many citywide efforts focused on revitalizing Peoria, including work to beautify and improve accessibility, provide more bike lanes and manage wet weather in smart, innovative ways.

"This is a great opportunity for everyone to engage in the changes happening in our city," said Public Works Director Scott Reeise. "We want people to come and explore parts of Peoria that they may not visit often and see the ways we're improving our public spaces."

The event is being held in conjunction with Limelight EventPlex/Working Man Productions, OneWater Peoria and WWCT FM/Advanced Media Partners

Community Development A new shuttle line is coming to Peoria!

From October 3 through November 11, two bus lines will operate during the business lunch hours (11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.). The service will be free of charge, and will generally encompass a perimeter from the Kickapoo building (edge of downtown), to baseball stadium, and along the riverfront.

This is a two-phase pilot program. The first six weeks are funded by the Tourism Reserve Fund for \$21,000; marketing is supported in part by the Downtown Development Corporation, the City of Peoria, Civic Center, Peoria Riverfront Association, and Peoria Area Convention and Visitor's Bureau. If successful, the DDC hopes to raise funds for eight additional weeks. More information will follow, in the coming weeks.

Peoria City/County Health Department—Flu News Release

The Peoria City/County Health Department is rallying the community this flu season to help protect against influenza. Businesses, schools, the faith community, and individuals are all encouraged to make protection against seasonal flu a priority. The message is simple:

Get your flu vaccine - it's available throughout the community.

Jean Bellisario, Director of Infectious Disease at Peoria City/County Health Department states, "With our flu season typically running November through May, now is actually a great time for the community to start promoting flu vaccination to help protect against seasonal influenza. We encourage businesses, schools, faith-based groups, as well as individuals to help spread the word about getting vaccinated against the flu. We encourage groups to use their worksite wellness programs, newsletters, and even their websites and social media posts to tell others about vaccination as the first and most important step in helping protect all of us against this serious disease."

This year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is recommending a flu vaccine for everyone 6 months of age and older. The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus which is different from a cold. While many people who get the flu recover in 1-2 weeks, some develop serious and potentially life-threatening medical complications. Every flu season is different and unpredictable. Getting vaccinated each year has proven to be the single best way to reduce the risk of getting the flu or spreading it to others who can't get vaccinated.

Bellisario adds, "This year the CDC recommends a flu shot for the best protection, rather than using a nasal spray which was not as effective in past years. Flu vaccines are available at many doctor's offices, health clinics, pharmacies, retail stores, and health departments throughout the area. We encourage people to visit one of these many convenient locations to get your seasonal flu vaccination!"

Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

The first Pillar of Our Path to 2020: High standards, Rigorous College and Career Curricula, and Engaged and Relevant Experience.

The term rigor has a very specific meaning to educators, referring to curriculum and to an approach to teaching.

When achievement data is stagnant, often one culprit is the curriculum. The Peoria Public Schools is addressing the curriculum in stages, led by Susan Grzanich, Chief Curriculum and Instructional Officer. The K - 5 reading curriculum was overhauled and is now focused on rigorous learning and connected learning

experiences. The remaining curricular areas already have or will be updated by August 2017, again with a focus on rigor.

Our team also is addressing rigor in the classroom. The word rigor, as defined by Learning Sciences International, means "cognitive complexity + student autonomy." Rigor, in this case, focuses on the work students are doing.

Cognitive complexity defines the thinking level of the task. Is it low level or high level? Student autonomy describes whether students are working independently on a task. We must analyze whether students are being given significant teacher support and extra information or engaging in productive struggle. Productive struggle means that a student must work hard, think at a complex level and solve problems or reach conclusions on their own. Teachers must strike a delicate balance. They must avoid allowing students to become frustrated without over-supporting student learning. Our goal is to give enough information to enable students to solve a problem or learn a concept without providing so much information that the students simply write down what a teacher says without requiring thinking.

Peoria Public School administrators spent two days this summer learning how to evaluate the level of rigor of student learning in classroom situations. Principals are now involved in those classroom assessments. The information they gather will guide our progress toward higher standards.

Our team is excited by this work. Building a more rigorous curricula and classroom environment will propel the Peoria Public Schools to higher achievement standards.

The 2016 PNC Bank Peoria Marathon and River City Races will be held on Sunday October 16th, 2016. The main events include: kids 1.2 mile, 5K, 25K, and a full marathon. The events are expected to bring in over 1500 runners participating in the four races. There will be wheelchair participants also competing in the marathon. The race course and overall event will be staffed by representatives from the Peoria Police Department, Peoria Office of Emergency Management, Peoria County Sheriff's Office, Illinois State Police, Peoria Park Police, Bradley University Police, Peoria Fire Department, West Peoria Fire, Peoria Public Works, Advance Medical Transport and REMERT. In addition, numerous volunteers from the area will be assisting officers, participants and spectators. Starting times for each race are listed in the following schedule of events.

Timeline:

0730 The 5K race will begin.

0735 Wheel Chair Race scheduled to begin (runs entire Marathon Route).

0740 Marathon scheduled to begin (Marathoners, Relay Teams, and ½ Marathon).

1330 Kids 1.2 mile run scheduled to begin.

1400 Marathon Officially ends

Once the routes have been shut down for the races, they will be kept closed until opened per the command post.

Schedule of Events:

The Marathon and 25K (0740 hrs) Race starting line is located at SW Jefferson at Liberty St. and will proceed throughout the downtown area. It will flow through the north end (Madison, Monroe and Abington Streets) and back into downtown, before heading into the Bradley University area. It will travel into West Peoria primarily using Western, Manor, Sterling and Heading, returning to the city on W. Main. It will travel on W. Main to North. The marathon will continue north on North Street through several neighborhoods and business areas. It will use Loucks, Isabell, Florence, Bigelow, Forrest Hill, Wisconsin, Prospect, Glen Oak, Spring, Monroe, Madison and Main Streets to finish inside the Civic Center Arena.

5K (0730 hrs) The 5K race will utilize the marathon course in the near Southside of Peoria. The runners will return to the Civic Center where the race will end in the Arena.

1.2 Kids Run (1330 hrs) The kids fun run will start at Liberty and Jefferson. It will proceed North on Adams to Bryan. They will turn on Bryan to Monroe and then south on Monroe. They will turn on Main to Jefferson and end in the Civic Center Arena.

Some of the streets along the course will be fully closed but the majority of the streets will be open to traffic with only a portion of the roadway dedicated for the use by race participants. The intersections along the course will be controlled by a combination of police officers and race volunteers. The traffic signals along the course will be placed on flash and they will be controlled by a uniformed officer directing traffic.

In most cases, traffic will be allowed to cross the race course when it can be done in a safe manner for the runners. The primary role of the volunteers and police officers along the route is the safety of the runners and participants. There will be delays in some locations and we ask for patience during these time.

Church Directions:

We are aware the Marathon route will cause disruption of travel to and from some of the churches depending on the time of services and location of runners on the route. When safe to do so, vehicle traffic shall be allowed to cross traffic posts.

Officers and volunteers should give the following directions to access the listed churches.

Morning Star Missionary, 413 W. John Gwynn. (1 Route)

1. Martin Luther King Dr to Hightower through traffic post then Hightower to John Gwynn. Exit using same routes or Hightower to SW Jefferson.

Saint Joseph Church, 103 S. Richard Pryor. (2 Routes)

1. MacArthur to Hurlburt east bound to Richard Pryor.
2. John Gwynn to Richard Pryor through traffic post right turn, south bound on Richard Pryor when safe. Exit same routes.

Sacred Heart Church, 504 Fulton.

1. Hamilton to Glendale west on Glendale to Kumpf. Kumpf to Monroe through traffic post. Right onto Fulton. Exit north on Fulton, west on Madison, north on Kumpf, northeast on Perry.

First United Methodist Church, NE Perry and Riverside Community Church, 714 Hamilton. (1 Route)

1. Access from Hamilton.

Saint Paul Baptist Church, 114 W. Forrest Hill (1 Route)

1. Access parking lot from east bound Forrest Hill only, west bound Forrest Hill between Bigelow and Knoxville will be closed. Additional access will be from Bigelow to Melbourne.
