Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

Whether managing a business, a household or a school district, fiscal responsibility and the wise use of resources sometimes requires making difficult decisions. In the case of the Peoria Public Schools, fiscal challenges and a teacher shortage experienced by school districts nationwide, prompted our decision to close The Contemporary School, housed at Woodruff Career and Technical Center (WCTC). The Contemporary School was created in 2011 specifically to give 6th- to 12th-grade students an alternative learning environment and smaller class sizes.

Currently, the Peoria Public Schools has over 50 classrooms and teaching positions filled by substitute staff. Placing certified teachers in these positions is critically important to every child we serve.

The Contemporary School opened with 125 students. Enrollment has decreased by consistent levels each year. This year, 65 students were enrolled, served by 14 teachers, a class size ratio of 1:4. In contrast, the same grade levels in other buildings have class size ratios of 1:20 to 1:30.

At the beginning of each school year, ideally before Labor Day, our administrative team reviews enrollment at each building to make adjustments if necessary. This year, it became clear that the most responsible decision is to close The Contemporary School and transition its 14 certified teachers to fill our teacher vacancies. To make a difficult transition somewhat less disruptive, we decided to close the school as quickly as possible so students could adjust.

We realize this decision is most difficult for the students and parents involved. This week we notified The Contemporary School staff, called parents and met with the students. The students will join their home school or placement school. We are focused on making the transition a positive experience. For example, the District's Social Emotional Learning (SEL) plan provides increased school-based support through community and healthcare partners including Children's Home and Family Core as well as increased SEL professional development for staff to ensure safe, caring and well-managed learning environments at every Peoria Public School. We will work through this together!

Kudos to Manual Academy for receiving a \$2,000 grant from the Dollar Stores Literacy Foundation. The grant will fund a "Meet the Author" project coordinated in collaboration with Bradley University's English and Teacher Education departments and the Peoria Public Library. The project focuses on the diverse young adult literature of Newberry Medal-winning author Matt de la Pena. Over a 12-week period, Manual 9th graders will read de la Pena's books and participate in weekly small

group book discussions with Bradley students. During the second semester, de la Pena will visit Peoria to meet with Manual Academy and Bradley students and make two public presentations at Peoria Public Library branches.




Peoria Cares Communication Transactions During the Month of August 2016


Peoria Cares August 2016 Complaint Status
