**City of Peoria and Partner Agencies Announce Text to 9-1-1 on Monday, August 8**

On Monday, August 8, 2016, the Peoria County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) will hold a Press Conference in the Community Room at the Peoria Police Department to announce the availability of Emergency Text to 9-1-1 in Peoria County. The press conference will begin at 11 a.m. Text to 9-1-1 service will be available for those individuals who cannot safely make a voice call to 9-1-1 in an emergency. This will also be a valuable service to the deaf and hard of hearing community. City of Peoria staff members and employees from partner agencies will be on hand to answer questions.

Testing for Text to 9-1-1 has been completed in Peoria County and is available with plans from AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile, US Cellular, and Verizon Wireless. Text to 9-1-1 may not be available outside of Peoria County. If a text is made to 9-1-1 where that service is not available, an automated bounce back message will be sent back to the phone advising the customer to make a voice call.

Some scenarios where texting to 9-1-1 would be appropriate are:

- Deaf, hard of hearing callers, or individuals with a speech disability.
- A caller that is unable to speak due to a medical or other condition.
- Emergency situations that would put a caller in danger if they were to make a voice call.
  - Examples include a home invasion, abduction, domestic violence, or active-shooter situation.

When texting to 9-1-1, follow these guidelines:

- Provide your address or exact location.
- Explain the type of emergency or help that is being requested.
- Be prepared to answer any questions that the 9-1-1 telecommunicator texts back.
- Use plain language; do not use abbreviations, symbols, or emoticons.
- Messages should be brief and concise.

Texting 9-1-1 can be done by typing “911” in the field for a phone number. No other numbers need to be used. Texting should be done through your wireless phones text messaging service and not from third party texting applications. Text to 9-1-1 does require an active telephone service plan or it will not work.

Remember, the best way to contact 9-1-1 is by making a voice call. Please utilize this service only in emergency circumstances where a voice call is not possible or safe.

The Peoria County ETSB is excited to offer text to 9-1-1 service to the citizens of Peoria County.

**Remember: CALL if you can, TEXT if you can't!**




This story of how heroin addiction became epidemic in small-town America was awarded the National Book Critics Circle Award for Nonfiction in March.

Author Sam Quinones will visit Peoria on **Tuesday, August 16<sup>th</sup>** and will present an evening program that will be free and open to the public at Riverside Community Church, 207 NE Monroe Street, at 7:00 p.m. In addition, he will meet with community leaders, law enforcement, and the media.

**Community Development Department – Code Enforcement Progress/Funding Report**

**Demolitions** – As of the end of July, the Community Development Department has exhausted all available funding for demolitions in 2016. These funds have allowed the City to remove sixty (60) blighting properties in 2016.

\$400,000 budgeted and expended in the Capital Budget for Demolition

\$166,000 budgeted and expended in the Operating Budget for Demolition

\$300,000 budgeted and expended in the South Village TIF for Demolition

The only available funding for demolitions in 2016 will be funding awarded through the State of Illinois Blight Reduction Program and that funding will only be allowed for a select group of properties in census tract 50 (Near South Side). The only other demolitions that will occur will be emergency demolitions due to fire or properties becoming structurally unsound.

**Work Orders** – The Community Development Department has spent 68% of the funding available for weed, litter, and garbage removal from private properties through the first half of 2016. \$76,000 remains in the account for weed and litter removal on private property for 2016. A total of 3,600 work orders have been issued through the end of July.

**Board Ups** – The Community Development Department has boarded up 238 properties in 2016 and spent approximately \$35,000 of the \$50,000 budgeted for board ups.

**Code Enforcement Action Comparison** – The major reason for the expenditures is due to the increase productivity level of the Community Development Staff. Below is a year to date comparison of the last four years of total actions by the Department.

**Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**

This week, high school students throughout the Peoria Public Schools became acquainted with the academic expectations of the International Baccalaureate (IB), Advanced Placement (AP) and Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) programs at Manual Academy, Peoria High School and Richwoods High School.

Manual Academy and Richwoods High School students worked together for three days at the Richwoods AP-IB Bootcamp. Activities were built on teamwork, problem-solving and critical-thinking skills needed for AP and IB classes. Students had to depend on their classmates to walk a tightrope stretched between two trees or to pass a hula-hoop around a group of students while holding hands. Peoria High School AVID and AP students focused on similar teamwork and study skills.

This week at Manual Academy, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students attend two-hour Transition Camps to familiarize students to their new building and to the academic expectations of middle and high school classes.

All of these programs help students prepare for the higher academic standards of high school.
