

COOLING CENTERS AVAILABLE



With temperatures expected to rise into next week, please remember that there are cooling centers available in Peoria. The lobby of the Police Department, 600 SW Adams Street, is open 24 hours. City of Peoria Fire Stations are also available until 10:00 p.m. Please note that in the event of a Fire-related emergency, visitors to the station will be asked to step out while staff is on a call.

Public Works and Office of the Mayor-Mayor's Youth Program Press Conference

Mayor Jim Ardis introduced the 2016 Mayor's Youth Program at a press conference on Monday, June 6. Guest speakers included Michael Rogers, Director of Public Works and Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat, Superintendent of Peoria Public Schools are also featured speakers.



The 2016 Program is a collaborative effort between the City of Peoria and Peoria Public Schools. This 8-week program, which runs from June 6th through July 28th, is designed to provide opportunities for Peoria-area youth in the Public Service sector. The program will focus on career pathway development and civic engagement by employing Peoria area youth to assist in infrastructure improvements, beautification and clean-up projects throughout the City. Participants will interact with various City Departments while learning about operations and projects. Additional components of the program include life skills development, learning workshops, career pathway lectures and business tours.

Peoria Fire Department/IEMA Press Release on Pet Plan

SPRINGFIELD – According to a recent survey by the American Pet Products Association, 65 percent of U.S. households include at least one pet. If your family includes a dog, cat, hamster or other furry, feathered or scaly friends, don't forget to include their unique needs in your home emergency plans.

Throughout the month of June, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and local emergency management agencies will highlight the importance of emergency preparedness for pets.

"Pets are beloved members of many families these days," said IEMA Director James K. Joseph. "That's why it's so important to include your pet's needs when developing your family emergency plan and stocking your emergency supply kit."

Joseph said home emergency supply kits for people should include a three-day supply of such items as food, water, first aid kit, weather alert radio, flashlights, spare batteries and other items. Pet owners should also have a pet preparedness kit stocked with items such as:

- At least a three-day supply of food and water
- Extra supplies of pet medicines
- Copies of pet registration, vaccinations and other important documents
- Photo of your pet in case you are separated during an emergency
- Collar with ID tag, harness or leash
- Crate or other pet carrier in case of evacuation
- Pet litter and box, newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and household chlorine bleach for sanitation
- Toys, treats or other familiar items to reduce your pet's stress during the emergency

A disaster may require you to evacuate your home, sometimes with little notice. It's important to take pets with you, as an evacuation could last several days, even weeks, and your pets likely cannot survive without care. Plan now for places you and your pets can stay following an evacuation, as many public shelters do not allow animals inside.

It's also important to have a back-up emergency plan in case you can't care for or evacuate your animals yourself. Talk to neighbors, friends and family to make sure someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are unable to do so.

Peoria Police Department—Police Explorer Program Makes the AP

PEORIA, Ill. (AP) - Cristian Munoz knew he wanted to serve, he just didn't know how.

The path was laid out for him in ways no one could have foreseen.

Last month, he graduated from Illinois Central College with a degree in criminal justice. He'll be sworn in as a Peoria police officer this month, just days before he leaves for the Police Training Institute in Champaign. That's not unusual. Here's what is: Munoz, 21, is the first person to complete the newly resurrected Police Explorer program and be hired by the city as an officer.

"I knew that I wanted to give back. I knew that I wanted to help my community and at first, I was looking to go into the military, to serve my country," he said. "But then I thought that I could do more here by standing home and helping people here."

And that's what has Officer Dan Duncan so happy. Duncan, who along with Officer Aaron Watkins, revived the Explorer program after a near 20-year hiatus, believes community policing is the way to go.

"Be a go-getter, chase the bad guys. That's part of the job. But on the flip side, do the extra stuff that needs to be done, like being a mentor to kids, meeting the neighbors and other community-orientated activities," he said.

Originally a branch of the Boy Scouts, Explorers is now a separate entity. While still under the auspices of the Scouts, Explorers don't use any of the rituals or mottos from that program. The idea is to take members 14 to 21 years old and use officers to show them what it is like to be police officer.

Explorers learn police tactics, state and local laws, customs and leadership skills. Think Junior ROTC, but instead of a military bent, the youths learn about law enforcement. They go on ride-alongs and after a probationary period and test, get a uniform and help officers at events such as Steamboat Days.

To that end, the 25 Explorers in the unit learn to put community first. They learn that being a police officer is more than just "runnin' and gunnin'." It's about caring about people. And that caring is what cinched the career choice for Munoz, who will be one of the few Hispanic officers in the department if he completes PTI.

His home was broken into last year by a man with a handgun. The terrifying experience was made better, he said, by the officers who showed up later to investigate. He said the officers were compassionate and cared about his family.

"I viewed the police as a safety net, and as something that was a safe thing for me," he said.

Duncan says a few other Explorers are going to take the city's written exam for new officers in a few weeks. It's possible more Explorers could find their way onto the police force with Munoz, who credits the program with getting him a dream job out of school.

"Without this program, I don't get the help that I need to get into the department," he said

Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

Swatches of felt, chenille sticks and pom-poms are typical summer camp craft supplies but at the Peoria Public Schools Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) camp they are crafted into soft, colorful working robots.

Summer is a time for learning and creativity for Peoria Public School students.

At the two-week STEM camp, held at Woodruff Career and Technical Center (WCTC) students and teachers are learning about robotics, 3-D printing and computer-aided design. The camp is a collaboration between Caterpillar, the University of Illinois Extension and the University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana Fab Lab. Approximately 60 5th through 8th grade students and seven teachers rotate through four learning stations daily.



Michelle Unser, Caterpillar STEM outreach lead, works with Lego Robotics portion of the camp. Working with Lego Mindstorm kits, students build and program robots to move and detect color and touch. Fellow Cat employees and local adult robotics team coaches are also volunteering at the camp.

Another station staffed by University of Illinois Fab Lab volunteers uses open source software to design and produce decals using a vinyl-cutting printer. The

decals are then used to screen print t-shirts. A final station, also staffed by U of I Fab Lab volunteers, introduces campers to 3-D printing.

Nearby, at Lincoln K-8, kindergarten, first and second grade students gather each morning to strengthen their reading skills at Reading Explorers Camp.



At Glen Oak Community Learning Center, three summer programs are currently in session. The English Language Learners (ELL) camp serves 157 pre-kindergarten through 8th-grade students, giving them a chance to review material in all subject areas and strengthen their English skills.

Glen Oak also houses two Transition Camps for students moving from 4th to 5th grade and from 8th to 9th grade. The camps help students strengthen study and social –emotional skills needed to successfully move to the next academic level.

Glen Oak is one of four Peoria Public School Compass Learning Lab locations open Monday through Thursday mornings during June and July. Compass Learning Labs help students make up missed work and work on academic areas that need strengthening. In addition to Glen Oak, Compass Learning Labs are open at Lincoln, Hines Primary School, Lindbergh Middle School and Harrison Community Learning Center. Compass Learning Labs are open to any District student and include breakfast and lunch.

Next Monday, June 13, our exciting Lion King Experience program begins, giving rising 5th – 10th grade students the opportunity to participate in a production of The Lion King Jr. to be performed August 12 – 14 at the Peoria Civic Center Theater as part of the Ignite Peoria! arts festival.

Also next week Camp Invention, held at Glen Oak, will give two dozen students entering fourth grade a chance to design and build a variety of hands-on projects. Later in the summer, a week-long camp for students entering high school will introduce Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) concepts including Cornell notes and Socratic seminars.

Two Peoria Public Schools – Jamieson and Knoxville Center for Student Success (KCSS) – offer programs for students with special needs. About 50 high school students attend KCSS morning or afternoon sessions to make up missed credits for graduation.

The Peoria Public School summer programs are free, include free breakfast and lunch and some include transportation. The District food-service partner, Sodexo, also supplies breakfast and lunch Monday –
