The walk will encompass roughly 10 city blocks on West Howett Street. A reception featuring light refreshments will be held at Common Place at the conclusion of the walk. Those who would prefer not to walk may stay at Common Place until the tour has concluded

The City of Peoria faces many challenges regarding blight and abandonment in neighborhoods. Through the Board Up Beautification Project, students from Peoria Public Schools joined Jody Tockes from The Hive to paint on boards that were intended for properties slated to be demolished. When it is time for the

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properties to be demolished, the boards will then be moved to other properties on the demolition list, thus creating a moveable art gallery that brings beauty and awareness to neglected properties.

Peoria Fire Department--CARDIAC ARREST PATIENT SAYS THANKS

On December 22, 2015, the crew of Rescue 1 staffed with Fire Captain/Paramedic Joey Camp, Fire Engineer Ryan Calhoun and Firefighter Jason Whalen; were dispatched to the Riverplex Recreation and Wellness Center for a male having a seizure.

Rescue 1 received the call at 4:29 PM and arrived on scene at 4:31 PM. Upon arrival they quickly discovered during their initial patient assessment that the male patient (Michael Kenny) was actually in cardiac arrest. Mr. Kenny was exercising when he began to feel poorly. He sat down in a chair in the Riverplex lobby to reestablish his composure, when he began to decompensate. Riverplex staff noticed his condition and dialed 911. Mr. Kenny was pulseless and breathless.

The crew of Rescue 1 began High Performance/Pit Crew CPR and established an airway as a measure of breathing for the patient. The crew would also administer a shock of defibrillation to the patient. OSF Doctors were also on scene during the incident and would provide a crash cart. Paramedic Camp started an IV and administered advanced pharmacology to the patient. After approximately 2 minutes of CPR the patient's heart rhythm returned and breathing returned with slow shallow breaths.

Advanced Medical Transport would arrive at 4:35 PM; at which time Rescue 1 would transfer patient care. Fire Captain/Paramedic Joey Camp would accompany AMT to OSF, to assist with the additional pre-hospital care efforts.

On June 7, 2016 Michael Kenny would arrive at Fire Central to say thank you to Peoria Fire Department crew. Michael Kenny stated that he felt obligated to let the members of Rescue 1 know his sincere appreciation for their efforts. On Friday June 10, 2016, Michael Kenny as an additional extension of his thankfulness, provided dinner for the entire crew of Fire Central.

High Performance /Pit Crew is a technique in which the Peoria Fire Department has been training on for the past two years. The goal of High Performance/Pit Crew CPR is to begin chest compressions immediately without interruptions along with good depth rates. Additionally, responders are assigned specific roles and alternate between the roles too maximize effectiveness.

Police Department-Illinois Click It or Ticket Mobilization Results

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), the Illinois State Police and hundreds of local law enforcement agencies joined forces during the recent Click It or Ticket mobilization. Enforcement zones and saturations patrols were conducted from May 16-30, with a focus on cracking down on seat belt law violators and impaired drivers in an effort to make Illinois roadways safer.

During this timeframe, The Peoria Police Dept. issued:

- 11 seat belt citations
- 1 child safety seat citation
- 3 DUI arrests
- 24 cell phone citations
- 2 fugitives apprehended
- 1 suspended/revoked licenses
- 3 uninsured motorists
- 1 drug arrests

IDOT data shows that between 2010 and 2014, 3,075 people riding in vehicles died in crashes. Of those, 1,492 (about 48 percent) were properly buckled. That means more than 50 percent of those who died in crashes during this timeframe were not properly buckled. Even though the Click It or Ticket mobilization has ended, officers enforce seat belt laws year round. Be sure to buckle up in both front and back seats, day and night, every trip, every time.

Illinois law also requires children to be properly restrained at all times while driving. Child passengers must ride in a car seat or booster seat until age 8, and passengers under 13 years old should ride in the back seat.

Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

2015-2016 was a record year for The Peoria Public Schools Foundation in terms of fundraising, events and growth. It was the best fundraising year on record for the uniform fund, allowing the Foundation to distribute hundreds of uniforms, coats and shoes to students at nearly every Peoria public school.

Here are some other major accomplishments by our Peoria Public Schools Foundation:

- The Foundation awarded approximately \$69,000 in scholarships and classroom grants.
 - 20 classroom grants totaling \$19,031 to fund lessons and events on a variety of topics including the future of farming, fitness, science and technology, reading and machines.
 - College scholarships totaling \$20,950, awarded to 18 high school graduates.
 - Another \$25,000 in alumni renewals was awarded to ten alumni.
 - \$3,750 was given to 21 middle school students for scholarships and summer camps.

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- The Foundation Horizons Club weekly lunch and learn career exploration program expanded to every one of our middle schools, bringing one-on-one career mentorship to over 700 students.
- Finally, the Foundation's primary achievement of 2015-2016 is the collaboration with the Junior League of Peoria to revive the Adopt-A-School program and secure three years of funding for a program coordinator. Adopt-A-School pairs businesses and nonprofit groups with schools, to help every school fulfill unmet needs, such as tutors, volunteers or financial support for special programs.

Peoria City/County Health Department—Get Recommended Vaccines Now

HPV vaccine is a series of 3 shots recommended for boys and girls 11-12 years of age and older if not completed at 11-12. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that each year there are 14 million new HPV infections with half of those in 15-24 year olds. HPV infection can lead to cancers such as cervical cancer and some oral and anal cancers. Completing the three dose series of HPV vaccine before exposure helps to protect against HPV infection and the cancers it causes.

Bellisario further states, "HPV vaccination at 11-12 years of age has a great impact on cancer prevention. We still have work to do to help all of our young people become fully vaccinated to reduce the risk of disease and these HPV-related cancers."

Community Core Initiative Plants a Rain Garden in the East Bluff

Volunteers from the East Bluff, Keep Peoria Beautiful, GenU, the City of Peoria, EBNHS, and LISC come together.

June 10th, 2016 – For Immediate Release

Peoria, Ill – Saturday, June 18th, volunteers from the East Bluff neighborhood, Keep Peoria Beautiful, Generation United, City of Peoria, EBNHS, and LISC will spend the day planting a rain garden along E. Nebraska Ave.

In 2016, the Community Core Initiative wanted to include efforts to improve infrastructure throughout the East Bluff neighborhood. Thanks in large part to District Councilman Timothy Riggerbach, the 2016 Community Core boundaries now include a brand new sidewalk along E. Nebraska Ave. from N. California Ave. to N. New York Ave. Prior to the installation of this strip of sidewalk, there was an overgrown footpath created by children walking to school. The installation of this new sidewalk means that children no longer have to cross a busy street to get to a sidewalk or walk in the road to get to school.

East Bluff Neighborhood Housing Services, Inc. and those at the City of Peoria, saw this as an opportunity to encourage East Bluff residents to start considering creating rain gardens on their properties as the City works to resolve the combined sewer overflow (CSO) issue. The purpose of this and other rain gardens is to restore the natural water cycle using native plants, which will absorb water before it enters the sewer system.

Planting will take place on E. Nebraska Ave. between N. New York Ave. and N. California Ave. from 8am to 2pm. In addition to the planting, sidewalk paint will be available for the kids to turn Nebraska Avenue into a work of art!

East Nebraska Ave. from N. New York to N. California Ave. will be closed from 7:30am – 2:30 pm for this community event.

Media are invited to cover the work taking place. *East Bluff Community Organizer, Schuyler Brock, will be available to answer questions about the Community Core Initiative, as well as, future projects. Keep Peoria Beautiful board members will be on hand to answer any questions about native plants.*

The rain garden is part of the visible transformation already taking place in the East Bluff as a result of the Community Core Initiative. The Community Initiative targets two primary areas of concern in the East Bluff and South Side as identified by residents and local leaders: blight and safety. Ultimately, the initiative aims to create neighborhoods that are safe and beautiful places to live.

Greater Peoria LISC partners with East Bluff Neighborhood Housing Services in the East Bluff and PCCEO on the South Side.

From the Desk of Thomas F. Duffy, Chair, MS-ISAC

Summer is finally here and for many of us that means it's time to get away! It's not surprising that many cyber criminals target travelers. Luckily, with a little care it's possible to protect yourself and avoid potential problems.

Sharing isn't always caring

- Avoid publicly posting details of where and when you'll be traveling. When you reveal these specifics, you are providing information that could be used by criminals to target your home or your family while you're gone.

Sending private posts and photos during your vacation to family and friends is ok, but if you post them publicly, you increase the risk of someone using that information for malicious activities.

Just as important as using discretion when posting, is making sure your children and friends understand the risks associated with posting your vacation plans.

- Do not use public computers and open wireless networks for sensitive online transactions. Wi-Fi spots in airports, hotels, coffee shops, and other public places can be convenient but they're often not secure and can leave you at risk. If you're accessing the Internet through an unsecured network, you should be aware that malicious individuals might be able to eavesdrop on your connection. This could allow them to steal your login credentials, financial information, or other sensitive information. Any public Wi-Fi should be considered "unsecure."

Keep in mind that if you are traveling abroad, different countries have different laws, which may allow government employees or law enforcement full access to your device without your knowledge or permission. It's also important to know the local laws regarding online behavior, as some online behaviors, such as posting disparaging comments or pictures of illegal activity on social media websites, can be illegal.

Consider turning off features on your computer or mobile devices that allow you to automatically connect to Wi-Fi and other services such as social media websites. Also consider using a cellular 3G/4G connection as a hotspot, which is generally safer than an open Wi-Fi connection. If you do connect through your hotel's Wi-Fi, verify the name of the Wi-Fi hotspot with hotel staff.

Recommendations

- Use discretion when posting information online. Consider keeping your social media pages private, so only authorized individuals can visit.
- Password protect your devices so if they are lost or stolen the information is protected; and enable device tracking.
- Make sure your laptop and other mobile devices have the latest patches installed. Your software vendor should notify you whenever an update is available. Set your device to auto update.
- Use of security software is a must. Some programs can also locate a missing or stolen phone, tablet or other similar device, while others will back up your data and can even remotely wipe all data from the phone if it is reported stolen. Definitely make sure you have anti-virus software installed, updated and running.
- Do not access sensitive accounts (e.g. banks, credit cards, etc.) or conduct sensitive transactions over public networks, including hotel and airport Wi-Fi and business centers, or Internet cafes. Use wired connections instead of Bluetooth or Wi-Fi connections, whenever possible.
- Do not plug USB cables into public charging stations; only connect USB powered devices using the intended AC power adapter as USB cables can be used to

The University Street (Forrest Hill Ave to War Memorial Dr) Project is about to get underway. We view this project as a partnership, with the Contractor, **Illinois Civil Contractors, Inc.**, the City of Peoria, the businesses, and residents, as stakeholders in the project.

The City of Peoria and the Contractor are pledged to provide the best possible project.

Construction Schedule (To Begin June 20th)

News outlets and the City's homepage will carry notices of the Project starting this week.

University Street, from Forrest Hill Avenue to War Memorial Drive, will be reconstructed with the new sidewalks separated from the curb, new asphalt surface, new curb and gutter, new storm drain inlets and pipework, new subsurface French Drain system, new water main from War Memorial Dr to Merle Ln, upgraded signals at Florence Ave, ornamental lighting, and undergrounding of the

existing lines that cross over University Street. All existing driveway approaches will be removed and replaced with Portland Concrete Cement pavement along the roadway. Existing entrance walks and driveways behind the sidewalks shall be removed, and replaced for adjustment purposes, only as necessary. All disturbed areas will be restored with sod.

The construction will begin at a highly-accelerated pace on Monday, June 20th with traffic control installation. Removal crews will begin

removing driveways then placing back temporary drivable surfaces. There will be *two phases* to this construction project. The *first* phase will remove and replace all curbs, sidewalks, and storm sewer systems. The *second* phase will include the mill and overlay of the road's asphalt surface. That phase will be let for bids this summer.

The project is expected to be complete by late fall this year.

Construction Schedule, continued...



Children are welcome to view the work and equipment, but only under direct parental supervision. A work site is dangerous to the uninitiated or unwary!

The contractor will, at times, take the parking lane of the street for staging of materials and equipment. Also, construction workers will be present.

Motorists are urged to use caution in the construction area at all times.



Temporary access to driveways along University Street will be provided during construction efforts, but each driveway will be closed for up to 7 days at a point to reconstruct with new concrete.

Two independent crews, both operated by Illinois Civil Contractors, Inc. will begin at opposite ends of the corridor. One will start around Forrest Hill Avenue and work in the north-bound lanes; the other will work around War Memorial Drive and work in the southbound lanes.

⇒ Sidewalk Concrete Cracking

All Portland cement concrete will crack. By its very nature, concrete does not do well under the tension created as the material cures and gains strength. This tension is the reason the grooves are placed. By providing these grooves, we introduce a point of weakness to cause the crack to be in the bottom of the groove. Also in an effort to control the cracking, expansion joints are placed at about 40-foot intervals. Further, small fibers are placed

within the concrete. All these efforts--control, expansion joints, and fiber--are attempts to control cracking. In addition to these measures, all materials used are inspected to ensure their compliance to job specifications. All project personnel are concerned about the quality of the finished product.

⇒ Contractor Doing Private Work

One question often raised is: "Can the contractor do work on my private property?" The City has

no objection to our contractor doing work for adjacent property owners while constructing the University Street project. The Resident Engineer will coordinate that work with the City's contractor. The cost of private work must be paid directly to the contractor by the Property Owner.

If you wish to use a different contractor for private work, you may. Again, the Resident Engineer will coordinate the work.

A winter "helpful hint"

To keep your new sidewalk in good shape: Refrain from using de-icing chemicals such as salt or calcium chloride on new concrete. Instead, use sand or kitty litter, for traction.

Trash Collection...

Vehicles in the area from the construction activities may affect your refuse collection. Sometimes collection schedules may be changed to occur before construction workers and equipment arrive, and sometimes schedules cannot be changed and collection must occur during the time construction activities are underway. To assist in the refuse collection process and minimize the possibility of missed collections during the construction of your project:

- Make sure that your private trash removal companies are notified ahead of collection dates. The number of lanes on University Street will be limited during the construction. Side streets and alleys will be closed down for short periods, and PDC will be notified of short term closures ahead of trash and recycling pickup days.




Peoria Cares Communication Transactions During the Month of May 2016


Peoria Cares May 2016 Complaint Status
