**Mayor's Office-5<sup>th</sup> National Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation April 1-30**

Jim Ardis, Mayor of City of Peoria, is joining mayors across the country in asking residents to make a commitment to conserve water and cut pollution by taking part in a national contest aimed at drastically slashing water and energy use across the nation—and in return residents can win a new Toyota Prius, water saving fixtures and other prizes.

The Wyland Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation, April 1-30, is a non-profit national community service campaign to see which leaders can best inspire their residents to make a series of informative and easy-to-do- online pledges to reduce water and energy usage.

The City of Peoria is currently facing several wet weather issues specific to the area and water conservation can help with these challenges. Mayor Ardis stated, "Using water wisely saves it for future generations. From rain barrels to planting native plants in rain gardens, our efforts to conserve now will impact others later." Mayor Ardis is encouraging Peoria residents to conserve water, save energy and reduce pollution on behalf of Peoria at [mywaterpledge.com](http://mywaterpledge.com) throughout the month of April. Last year, residents from over 3,900 cities in all 50 U.S. states, pledged to reduce their annual consumption of freshwater by 1.5 billion gallons, reduce waste sent to landfills by 47 million pounds and prevent more than 141,000 pounds of hazardous waste from entering our watersheds.

Cities with the highest percentage of residents who take the challenge in their population category are entered into drawings for hundreds of eco-friendly prizes, including home improvement gift cards, home irrigation equipment and a Grand Prize Toyota Prius.

The challenge also features additional resources for residents to take their commitment of conservation even further, from regional water and energy resource issues to cost-saving tips at home.

The 5th National Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation is presented by the Wyland Foundation and Toyota, with support from the U.S EPA WaterSense, The Toro Company, National League of Cities, Conserva Irrigation, and Earth Friendly Products (makers of ECOS).

Founded in 1993 by environmental artist Wyland (best known for his series of 100 monumental marine life murals), the Wyland Foundation, a 501c3 non-profit organization dedicated to promoting, protecting, and preserving the world's ocean, waterways, and marine life. With an appointment, people can also meet with an AARP Tax Aide at the Peoria Public Library. This gives people the opportunity to work one on one to answer any tax related questions at no cost.

### **DREAM CENTER PEORIA AND MEGA REPLAY LEAD AREA BUSINESSES IN FIGHT ON MENTAL HEALTH** ***Organizations Set to Host Health Expo and Video Game Tournament Benefiting Peoria Teens***

Peoria, Ill. - Dream Center Peoria and Mega Replay have teamed up to address the unmet mental health needs of Peoria area teens and young adults. The groups will host a superhero themed expo with health advice from local experts, appearances by therapy animals, a photobooth, face painting, video game tournaments, and prizes.

"Turbulent. Exhilarating. Confusing. Real. These words describe living, being, and growing up as a teen," said Jody Smith-Brown, the director of development at the Midwest Food Bank. She previously spent 18 years working with young adults at the Children's Home and has seen the effects of poor mental health in teens. "The hard-hitting issues - substance abuse, stress, alcohol, poverty, self-esteem, relationships, sex - play a role, but more emphasis need to be placed on teens' power of choice."

Dream Center Peoria and Mega Replay will host the Healthy Heroes Expo from 2-5 p.m. on Saturday, April 2. The free event will take place at 714 Hamilton Blvd., in Dream Center's seven-story facility. The event is open to all Peoria teenagers and their families. Free pizza will be provided by One World Cafe.

The Director of Homeless Housing at Dream Center Peoria, Kristy Schofield, will serve as the keynote speaker for the event. Schofield, a formerly homeless mother, has experienced her fair share of ups and downs. She will engage the audience in an open discussion covering depression and social stigma in our community. Participants will then be invited to take the "Hero Pledge" - a promise to help improve the state of mental health in Peoria. The event will conclude with Mario Kart and Wii Bowling tournaments led by Mega Replay volunteers. Gameplay is restricted to junior high and high school students. Four personal drones with HD cameras are to be given out as prizes for tournament winners.

With no state budget in sight, organizations dependent on state-funding and the communities they serve are suffering the consequences in notable ways. Grant cuts and the reallocation of funds have resulted in the dwindling of options available to those who are asking for help. The Healthy Heroes Expo will highlight a number of low cost or free resources that are still available to community members who need support.

The 2015 Peoria County Community Health Indicator Report concluded that Peoria's suicide rates were over twice the Illinois average, making mental health awareness a serious issue facing our community. According to the Peoria County Coroner's office, 30 individuals took their own life last year. There are a reported 1.5 million people in Illinois living with some form of mental illness.

"I think that the stigma and shame that are associated with mental health issues are a big factor for anyone that is struggling with mental health issues," said Kathy Harvey, an educator with the *Youth Mental Health Matters* project at the Hult Center for Healthy Living. "People often don't understand the underlying causes of mental illness and mistakenly think that the person could just choose to get better if they wanted to."

Some of the organizations showcasing their services at the event include: the National Alliance on Mental Illness, the South Side Office of Concern, Children's Home, Big Brothers Big Sisters, and more. All participating organizations recognize the need for community dialog and strive to bring awareness to the increasing mental health issues in Peoria.

The overarching goal of this campaign is to alleviate pressure from the stigma surrounding mental illness by providing a safe, fun environment for judgement free dialogue. All participants are encouraged to dress in "hero" costumes for the event.


### **Purchasing Diversity Seminar**

On March 9, 2016, at the Gateway Building, the City of Peoria, in collaboration with the Peoria Park District, County of Peoria, Peoria Housing Authority and City Link hosted the ninth (9th) annual government purchasing diversity seminar. Twenty-Two companies from around the area attended.

Attendees meet with government purchasing agents to learn about the procurement process and discuss current and future bid opportunities.

The event featured representatives from Illinois American Water and Ameren discussing opportunities they have and how minority and women owned businesses can participate in their procurement process.

Three minority / women owned businesses, seeking to become first time vendors, contacted the City of Peoria purchasing department to follow up on the seminar and to go into greater detail about the products or services they offer.

### **PSD 150 – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**

Beginning in October 2015, a group comprised of representatives from the Peoria Public Schools, the Peoria Public Schools Foundation, the Peoria County Regional Office of Education, community social service agencies and community volunteers began researching the issue of school attendance.

My colleague, Regional Superintendent Beth Derry and I initiated the Attendance Committee because we consider school attendance to be fundamental. Research bears this out. In 2010, Sarah Sparks wrote in Education Week: “A growing consensus of research points to chronic absence – defined by the national policy group Attendance Counts as missing 10 percent of school or more – as one of the strongest and most overlooked indicators of a student’s risk of becoming disengaged, failing courses, and eventually dropping out of school.”

Committee leaders Dr. Thom Simpson and Mrs. Cheryl Sanfilip have gathered significant research on the link between attendance, drop out rates and student achievement. Their work shows that attendance patterns emerge as early as kindergarten and that high absenteeism is particularly harmful to low-income students. Students with low attendance in both pre-K and kindergarten often continue to that pattern. These children are more likely to be retained by the third grade and on average have lower academic outcomes than peers with better attendance.

Attendance problems also can emerge during the transition from middle to high school. Among the findings of a 2007 University of Chicago study:

- The research suggests that the transition between eighth grade and ninth grade played a critical role in shaping students' long-term outcomes, and demonstrated that students' attendance and course performance in the ninth grade year were highly predictive of high school dropout.
- Nearly 90% of freshmen who miss less than a week of school per semester graduate, regardless of their 8<sup>th</sup> grade test scores.

Research in hand, the Attendance Committee is formulating strategies to improve attendance rates on a district and individual school level. One important goal, says Sanfilip, is to educate parents on how important it is for children to be in school every day. The recently adopted First Day Compliance policy, requiring every students' health records to be submitted on the first day of the 2016-17 school year, will also contribute to higher attendance rates.

I invite you to review the research of the Attendance Committee, which is available at [www.psd150.org](http://www.psd150.org). I welcome the community's thoughts and feedback on how to address this vital concern.





**Dear Citizens of Peoria County:**

The Peoria County Board of Health is pleased to present your Peoria City/County Health Department's Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2015. With a hard working staff, the Health Department provide services and programs and engages the community in promoting and protecting your health and well-being.

Key accomplishments this year can be found on our website [www.pcchd.org](http://www.pcchd.org) and include:

1. Achieving national accreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board. The newly formed Accreditation Board recognizes health departments that demonstrate increased accountability to the public by meeting a set of stringent national standards for efficiency, effectiveness, and quality improvement.
2. Improving data communications by publishing the Community Health Indicator Report showing progress and need to address risk factors of health including data such as leading causes of death, 30% of adults are obese, 2 in 3 teen girls have not received full HPV vaccine series for cancer prevention, STDs in some zip codes are up to 10.7 times greater than national averages.
3. Mobilizing our community through collaborative partnerships and policy development to promote best practices and interventions that address our high teen pregnancy and STD rates, striving toward a tobacco-free community, managing emerging infectious diseases and environmental health hazards, and addressing the high obesity rates in children and adults.

The Board of Health recognizes that the challenges we face can provide us with the opportunities to expand partnerships, address newly emerging disease threats, reduce exposure to environmental health risks, and increase efficiencies in operations of resources and funding.

The Board of Health and Health Department staff are proud to be part of a public health system that demonstrates a proactive approach to health protection for all.

## **Community Health Policy & Planning (CHPP)**

*The CHPP Division collaborates and engages with the community to create a shared vision for population health improvement and to evaluate the Department's efforts and impact on community health outcomes within Peoria County and across the region.*

### **Mobilizing for Action through Policy and Planning (MAPP)**

*In partnership with Tazewell and Woodford County Health Departments, CHPP initiated MAPP, a community-driven, strategic planning process for improving community health. As part of this process, the Tri-County Community Health Collaborative, representing hospitals, clinics, public health, and the United Way, is working to identify the most important health issues impacting individuals and families in our region.*

### **Reproductive Health Workgroup (RHW)**

*To help address the long-standing health issues around the high rates of STIs and teen births in Peoria, the RHW and community partners hosted two panel presentations to medical and service providers on the scope of the health issues, a review of best practices in clinical sexual education, and STI prevention and treatment. The RHW also coordinated training for educators and community agency partners, as well as Peoria Public School District 150 staff to implement Family Life and Sexual Health (F.L.A.S.H.) - a comprehensive sexual health education curriculum for 6th graders.*

### **Illinois Tobacco-Free Communities (ITFC)**

*The goals of ITFC are to prevent tobacco use among youth and eliminate exposure to second-hand smoke. In collaboration with Hult Center for Healthy Living and the Peoria County Sheriff's Office, we promote policy development and enforcement of the Smoke-Free Illinois Act. Policy interventions this year include promotion of tobacco-free multi-unit housing, campus, and outdoor space.*






### 2015 Revenues by Percentage
