Community Development--East Village Growth Cell Applications Now Available

Residents of Peoria's East Bluff may qualify for a new program that assists in residential improvements. Applications for the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program are now available. To be eligible for the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program, applicants must own and occupy property located within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF (Tax Increment Financing) district. A map of qualifying residential properties is included with the application.

The program will provide up to \$15,000 in assistance to home owners for qualifying residential improvements. The program is a 50/50 matching grant program. The minimum project is \$2,000, with a minimum matching grant of \$1,000 and the maximum project is \$30,000, with a maximum grant match of \$15,000. The property owner can reapply annually, but the maximum grant for a five year period may not exceed \$15,000. Eligible projects include exterior improvements, with the allowance for mechanical upgrades and energy efficiency improvements. The property owner must pay 100% of their cost (50% of the total project cost) to the contractor prior to any work being done. The City of Peoria will pay the remaining 50% directly to the contractor upon an approved final inspection.

Applications will be received by city staff in City Hall, Room 300 beginning February 15, 2016 and will be reviewed and approved on a first-come, first-serve basis, as funds are available. Public Works-Sandbag Efforts & Debris Removal

The ice storm, combined with the rising waters of the Illinois River had the Public Works crews out in droves. Pictured here are the sandbagging efforts from the week. As a result of downed limbs, the City of Peoria is assisting in storm debris collection. A copy of the news release, with recommendations for collection, is attached.

Public Works-Special Debris Removal

The City of Peoria will be picking up tree debris over a two week period between **Monday, January 4, 2016 and Friday, January 15, 2016**. Below is important information about this special service:

- Crews will begin pickup operations on Monday, January 4 and will make a first sweep that week. All debris must be put out for pickup by Monday, January 11 so that the remainder can be collected during a second sweep that week.
- Crews will move systematically through the City. Unlike normal PDC landscape operations, there is not a specific day that debris in a particular area will be collected.
- Citizens are asked to place debris at either the front curb or in the alleys. City crews will pick up from either location. Streets will be cleared first. Crews will then return to remove debris in alleys.
- For curbside disposal, please keep debris piles as close to the curb as possible and out of driving lanes. Avoid piling debris on sidewalks to help preserve walking paths.
- This effort is focused on tree limbs, branches and twigs. The City will not be collecting other types of landscape waste such as leaves or grass clippings. Those materials will need to be stored for when regular landscape collection resumes in the spring.
- City crews are limited in what they can pick up:
 - Crews will not come onto private property to remove debris. The City will remove debris from private trees that is brought to the curb or alley as specified below.
 - Sticks and branches should be bundled with twine (no plastic) and not exceed 50 lbs. in weight or 5 feet in length.
 - Crews will pick up unbundled larger limbs so long as they are not larger than 4 inches in diameter and cut into sections not longer than 5 feet.
 - While bundles are preferred, the City will collect from 45-gallon trash cans provided that there is no other trash and the can does not exceed 50 lbs. in weight. Cans should be clearly marked as "Landscape Only."

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- Due to restrictions from the disposer of collected debris, the City cannot collect debris in paper landscape bags. Debris instead should be bundled or placed in a 45-gallon trash can.
- The City does not have equipment to dump 95-gallon tote cans. The City will not collect debris from toters.
- The City will not pick up Christmas trees. These should be put out with your regular trash to be collected by PDC on their normal schedule.
- Residents with an entire downed tree(s) should call a private contractor for removal. City crews are unable to handle heavy sections of tree or root balls.

You do not need to request a pickup. Simply place your debris to the curb or alley prior to January 11 and the City will remove it by January 15.

PSD 150 – Update from Interim Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat

As educators, we evaluate students' performance on a daily basis. We use PBIS expectations to assess behavior in the classroom, the hallway, the cafeteria and the school bus. We evaluate academic progress through quizzes, tests, homework assignments, and standardized tests. Similarly, as part of our Strategic Planning Process, our leadership team is developing a detailed scorecard to track our progress in achieving the goals defined by the strategic plan. The scorecard measures key indicators that holistically capture the results of the District's efforts to achieve our vision – that each student graduate prepared and inspired to contribute to the world.

Some of the 50 or so items we are tracking have long been a part of District 150's traditional assessment process. These include the percent of students meeting targets on the state assessment, increased attendance rates, reductions in disciplinary referrals and the percent of students enrolled in a two- or four-year college within one year of high school graduation.

Some measurements clearly raise the bar on our expectations for the District and our students. The Strategic Plan calls for rigorous and challenging growth in many areas. For example, we will track and work to increase the number of students enrolling and passing dual credit, IB, AP and STEM courses in high school, as well as seniors completing a capstone project.

Some items on the scorecard grow directly from suggestions and feedback gained through the community forums in 2015. As suggested, we plan to increase the percentage of new hires from under-represented and high-need employee groups, and increase the number of Peoria Public School graduates returning as educators.

The Peoria Public Schools will only achieve these goals with the support and active involvement from the Peoria community. Parents can help by attending parent-teacher conferences and Parent University, by volunteering for their child's Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) and by making the commitment to read to their children each day. Our students, teachers and administrators depend on the services of the business community, churches, civic organizations and caring citizens to serve as volunteer Reading Buddies, Adopt-A-School partners, providing internships and summer employment for students,

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financial donations and other types of partnerships. Each of the specific areas will be tracked in coming years.

Our students will only achieve if District leadership are wise stewards of our resources whether human, financial or physical. This will include annual staff wellness and satisfaction evaluations and efforts to ensure the retention of staff who achieve superior appraisals. We plan to carefully monitor the use of instructional technology including hardware and software, and initiate efforts to improve the energy efficiency and sustainability of District facilities.

Any long-term project is easier to accomplish when it is broken down into smaller steps, particularly when those steps can be measured. Achieving the goals set forth in The Peoria Public Schools Strategic plan will require dedication and unwavering commitment. The scorecard will offer our constituents – parents, students, taxpayers and community partners – a transparent and accessible means to evaluate our progress.

The scorecard is still evolving. We invite citizens to go to www.psd150.org/strategicplan to download the latest draft of the plan. You can find the scorecard at the end of the PDF document. Once the plan receives approval from the Board of Education in the coming weeks, the scorecard will a measurement tool proudly displayed predominately on the District website. EAST VILLAGE GROWTH CELL TAX INCREMENT FINANCING DISTRICT (TIF)
HOUSING PROGRAM
GUIDELINES & APPLICATION

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The East Village Growth Cell Tax Increment Financing District (TIF) Housing Program is a grant program which provides up to \$15,000 of assistance to property owners of owner-occupied properties for permanent building and site improvements on parcels within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF.

To be considered for the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program, property must be located within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF and applicant(s) must own and occupy the property. Vacant property qualifies if proposed to be owner-occupied within 90 days from the date of completion of work associated with any approved application.

Level of Assistance:

The **East Village Growth Cell Housing Program** will provide up to \$15,000 in assistance to home owners for qualifying residential improvements. The program is a 50/50 matching grant program. The minimum project is \$2,000, with a minimum matching grant of \$1,000 and the maximum project is \$30,000, with a maximum grant match of \$15,000. The property owner can reapply annually, but the maximum grant for a five year period may not exceed \$15,000. Eligible projects include exterior improvements, with the allowance for mechanical upgrades and energy efficiency improvements. The property owner must pay 100% of their cost (50% of the total project cost) to the contractor prior to any work being done. The City of Peoria will pay the remaining 50% directly to the contractor upon an approved final inspection.

If an individual lives in an owner-occupied house and has an income less than 80% of the area median income, the individual may qualify for a 100% grant. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds may be used to pay for the owners match. Please contact City staff to determine if CDBG funds are still available and for income qualification guidelines.

Grant Award:

The following items are eligible for funding through this Program:

1. Exterior Improvements
2. Mechanical Systems Upgrades
3. Energy Efficiency Improvements

Application Window:

Applications will be available beginning in January 2016. Applications will be received by City Staff beginning February 15, 2016 and will be reviewed and approved on a first-come, first-serve basis, as funds are available.

The East Village Growth Cell Advisory Committee will review the number of applications received and approved, and disbursements made through the Program at the July 2016 meeting to determine the success of the Program. At this meeting, the Committee will determine if non-owner occupied properties will be allowed to apply to the program. Contract for deed properties would be included in the non-owner occupied timeline for submittal.

Resolution of Environmental Issues Prior to Program Assistance

The following items must be resolved prior to housing assistance being made available.

- All garbage, debris, old appliances, and dilapidated furniture must be removed from the exterior.
- Garbage and debris within the structure must be removed.
- Motor vehicle parts (including batteries and tires) must be removed.
- All grass and weeds must be less than 10 inches high at closing.
- No bushes, shrubs, or trees are permitted to block the public right-of-way.
- All unlicensed vehicles must be removed from the property or properly licensed.

Other Requirements / Information:

- Property taxes must be paid, no City liens (with the exception of mortgages) or other City debt (i.e. unpaid garbage bills, etc.) may exist on the property, and the property must have active homeowner's insurance coverage.
- Repairs that would be made under a homeowner's insurance policy will not be covered.
- If a property is found to have a code violation(s), funds received must be used to resolve violations as part of any loan application. At the time of post inspection, no code violations may be present.
- Property owners may only use contractors from the City of Peoria's rehabilitation contractor list. See attached list of approved contractors.

Applications for EVGC Housing Program funds by EVGC Advisory Committee Members

The intent of the EVGC Housing Program is for all property owners within the East Village Growth Cell to have equal opportunity to benefit from the Program if the above guidelines are met. EVGC Advisory Committee members residing within the EVGC boundary are eligible to apply for and receive funding through the EVGC Housing Program; however, in recognition of the perception of a conflict of interest, the final decision on all EVGC Housing Program applications will be made by City staff.

All applications must include the following documents:

1. Copy of recorded deed as proof of property ownership.
2. Insurance declaration page as proof of property insurance
3. Paid receipts or escrow statement as proof of paid property taxes
4. A current exterior and/or interior photograph of the building as it presently appears






East Village Growth Cell Housing Program Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program?

A: The East Village Growth Cell Tax Increment Financing District (TIF) Housing Program is a 50/50 matching grant program which provides up to \$15,000 of assistance to property owners of owner-occupied properties for permanent building and site improvements on parcels within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF. The minimum project is \$2,000, with a minimum matching grant of \$1,000 and the maximum project is \$30,000, with a maximum grant match of \$15,000. To be considered for the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program, property must be located within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF and applicant(s) must own and occupy the property.

Q: What is the Intent and Goal of the Program?

A: Without proper maintenance, a deteriorating structure can become a health and safety hazard to the occupants, as well as surrounding residents. Substandard housing can detract from the overall appearance of the neighborhood and can negatively affect property values. The City of Peoria has authorized a portion of the East Village Growth Cell TIF funds to be used for this housing program to assist property owners wanting to rehabilitate residential property located within the East Village Growth Cell Tax Increment Financing District to achieve the following goals:

1. To provide financial assistance to home owners in the East Village Growth Cell area to enhance their investment in improving the quality of dwellings in the neighborhood, by doubling the overall investment in the neighborhood.
2. Improve the quality of life for homeowners and residents in the East Village Growth Cell area by assisting them with repairs and/or property improvements to make their homes decent, safe, and sanitary.
3. Preserve and enhance the quality of the neighborhood as well as the value of public capital invested in the streets, utilities and other public facilities.
4. Assist with home improvements creating pride of ownership, preserving the value of the homeowners' equity and creating happiness and well-being for the occupants.
5. Increase the equalized assessed valuation of properties within the East Village Growth Cell boundary.
6. To catalyze further investment within the East Village Growth Cell area beyond funding provided by the East Village Growth Cell Housing Program.

Q: What are the boundaries of the East Village Growth Cell TIF?

A: The attached map shows the proposed boundaries of the study area.

Q: What exterior improvements are eligible?

A: Eligible exterior improvements include, but are not limited to, repair and/or replacement of the following items:

- Exterior painting or walls, trim, and/or fascia
- Tuck-pointing, masonry
- Windows and doors
- Driveways and retaining walls
- Roofs, porches, foundations, exterior stairs
 - Landscaping when part of an overall landscaping plan or associated with other improvements funded through this program.
 - New construction and additions

Applications will be reviewed on a case by case basis to ensure compliance with the EVGC Housing Program guidelines and the Illinois TIF Act requirements.

Q: What interior improvements are eligible?

A: Eligible interior improvements include, but are not limited to, repair and/or replacement of the following items:

- Mechanical systems

Applications will be reviewed on a case by case basis to ensure compliance with the EVGC Housing Program guidelines and the Illinois TIF Act requirements.

Q: What type of improvements are ineligible for funding through the EVGC Housing Program?

A: Ineligible projects include, but are not limited to:

- Temporary improvements
- Appliances and fixtures
- Pools

Q: If the project cost is higher or lower than the approved amount how is this handled?

A: The homeowner pays 50% of the approved cost. Should the actual cost be less than anticipated, the homeowner will not receive a rebate from the city. The homeowner is responsible for any additional cost outside the approved contract. The home owner can re-apply for funds to cover the additional cost if necessary

Q: Can I use any contractor of my choice?

A: No, applicants may only use city approved contractors. If you know someone who would like to be registered as a City approved contractor please have them contact the City of Peoria.

Q: Where can I find the approved contractors list?

A: Please go to the City of Peoria website under the Purchasing Division to see a list of the approved contractors

Q: How long will the EGVC program stay open?

A: The program will remain open till funds are depleted

Q: What are the requirements to participate in the program?

A: Applicants must be aware of the following:

- Property taxes must be paid, no City Liens (with the exception of mortgages) Or other City debt (i.e. unpaid garbage bills, etc.) may exist on the property, and the property must have active homeowner's insurance coverage
- Repairs that would be made under a homeowner's insurance policy will not be covered
- If a property is found to have a code violation (s), funds received must be used to resolve violations as part of any loan application. At the time of the post inspection, no code violations may be present.

Q: What documents do I need to bring when turning in my application?

A: Applicants need to bring in the following items when turning in application

- Copy of recorded deed as proof of property ownership
- Insurance declaration page as proof of property insurance
- Paid receipts or escrow statement of paid property taxes
- A current exterior and/ or interior photograph of the building as it presently appears

Q: Can I do more than one project a year?

A: The applicant can do as many projects as he/she wishes as long as they do not exceed the \$15,000 limit threshold for total projects.

Q: If my property is currently contract for deed, can I still participate in the program?

A: No, contract for deed or any other type of contract will not be accepted. The applicant must be the outright owner of the property to participate in the program.

Q: Once approved to start work on my property, how long is my application valid for?

A: Applications are invalid if work does not start within 90 days of the date of the Notice to Proceed, unless an extension is approved by the City of Peoria.

The City of Peoria will be picking up tree debris over a two week period between **Monday, January 4, 2016 and Friday, January 15, 2016**. Below is important information about this special service:

- Crews will begin pickup operations on Monday, January 4 and will make a first sweep that week. All debris must be put out for pickup by Monday, January 11 so that the remainder can be collected during a second sweep that week.
- Crews will move systematically through the City. Unlike normal PDC landscape operations, there is not a specific day that debris in a particular area will be collected.
- Citizens are asked to place debris at either the front curb or in the alleys. City crews will pick up from either location. Streets will be cleared first. Crews will then return to remove debris in alleys.
- For curbside disposal, please keep debris piles as close to the curb as possible and out of driving lanes. Avoid piling debris on sidewalks to help preserve walking paths.
- This effort is focused on tree limbs, branches and twigs. The City will not be collecting other types of landscape waste such as leaves or grass clippings. Those materials will need to be stored for when regular landscape collection resumes in the spring.
- City crews are limited in what they can pick up:
 - Crews will not come onto private property to remove debris. The City will remove debris from private trees that is brought to the curb or alley as specified below.
 - Sticks and branches should be bundled with twine (no plastic) and not exceed 50 lbs. in weight or 5 feet in length.
 - Crews will pick up unbundled larger limbs so long as they are not larger than 4 inches in diameter and cut into sections not longer than 5 feet.
 - While bundles are preferred, the City will collect from 45-gallon trash cans provided that there is no other trash and the can does not exceed 50 lbs. in weight. Cans should be clearly marked as "Landscape Only."
 - Due to restrictions from the disposer of collected debris, the City cannot collect debris in paper landscape bags. Debris instead should be bundled or placed in a 45-gallon trash can.
 - The City does not have equipment to dump 95-gallon tote cans. The City will not collect debris from toters.
 - The City will not pick up Christmas trees. These should be put out with your regular trash to be collected by PDC on their normal schedule.
 - Residents with an entire downed tree(s) should call a private contractor for removal. City crews are unable to handle heavy sections of tree or root balls.

You do not need to request a pickup. Simply place your debris to the curb or alley prior to January 11 and the City will remove it by January 15.
