

### **The Tireless Project June 24**

The Tireless Project will hold its monthly collection of unwanted tires this Saturday, June 24. The collection site, located at 2301 S. Darst St., Peoria, is for PEORIA CITY RESIDENTS ONLY; hours of collection are 9:00–11:00 a.m. (may end earlier if the trailer is at capacity—approximately 1,000 tires). If tires are left after the designated hours, a \$200 fine for littering will be enforced.

Please note: THS DRIVE WILL BE CANCELLED DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER. PLEASE CHECK THE **TIRELESS PEORIA FACEBOOK PAGE** FOR ANY CANCELLATIONS

Please note the following restrictions to the drop-off:

- The limit is 20 tires per customer; this is a legal requirement for transporting tires.
- First 10 tires are FREE; there is a \$1.00 charge for each tire over 10—CASH ONLY. (Funds will be used for project supplies and neighborhood cleanups.)

- Only City of Peoria residents can participate; no businesses will be allowed.
- Customers must have proof of residency in the form of a driver's license, state ID OR property tax statement.
- No tires with rims will be accepted.
- Only passenger and truck tires 17" or less will be accepted; no oversized tires, including agricultural and commercial, will be accepted.

The Tireless Project, initiated in 2015 by Peoria volunteers, successfully collected approximately 3,800 tires in their inaugural year.

### **Iteams--South Side Stormwater Pilot Project Community Meeting Monday, June 26**

The City of Peoria and Fresh Coast Capital will host a public meeting to learn about a project that will reduce stormwater pollution using urban agriculture in Peoria's First District. Attendees will be asked to and contribute design ideas for the site.

Last year, the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) of the US Department of Agriculture awarded Fresh Coast Capital, with the City of Peoria, gitm (Gifts in the Moment) Foundation and AKRF \$1M in funds to install an urban agriculture and stormwater management project in Peoria.

A team comprised of community organizers, engineers, environmental scientists, landscape architects, urban agriculture specialists, and archeologists have been working to identify a project site and develop a community agricultural and microbusiness training program. The project, formerly a city-owned parcel, is currently slated to be sited at 1015 Southwest Reed Ave in the 61605 neighborhood.

The June 26 community meeting is open to the public and designed to connect community leaders and interested residents with project partners to provide guidance on the overall

planning of the project. A Stakeholder Working and Advisory Group (SWAG) will also formally launch in the coming months to guide the development of the project.

### **Peoria Public Schools—Update from Superintendent Desmoulin-Kherat**

In early May, a group of about 30 professionals -- Peoria Public School educators, retired educators and community and business volunteers – gathered for Action Team Leader Training specifically charged with developing a strategic plan for Manual Academy. Former Peoria Public Schools Administrators Dr. Thom Simpson and Mrs. Cheryl Sanfilip are leading the effort.

Manual Academy principal Elizabeth Zilkowski and I are excited about the work of the Action Teams and about watching the implementation of their plans.

Manual Academy encompasses three separate programs: a middle school for grades 7 and 8; a 9<sup>th</sup> grade Academy to provide students a smooth transition to high school, and a high school for grades 10, 11 and 12. Manual Academy primarily serves students from the 61605 zip code.

The Manual Academy site planning follows a structured process beginning with the development of tactics. The tactics formed for Manual Academy are:

- We will develop and implement a professional development plan for Manual Academy.
- We will develop and implement a social/emotional curriculum and plan for Manual Academy.
- We will create and foster an environment that promotes pride and a positive school culture that fosters caring, promotes safety, models respect, and honors achievement.
- We will partner with the community to develop and implement a continuum of college and career opportunities for Manual Academy students using competency-based education.
- We will develop and implement a 9-14 Pathways in Technology early-college high school structure at Manual Academy.
- We will develop an Individual Learning Plans (ILP) and a process for implementation.
- We will create and implement a marketing plan for Manual Academy and the Manual community.

Each Action Team, consisting of four to six professionals, focuses exclusively on one tactic, brainstorming and defining specific criteria of successful implementation. A result is only considered successful if it can be measured, observed and attained within one year.

One tactic that may be unfamiliar to many in Peoria is the concept of a 9 – 14 P-Tech school. P-Tech stands for Pathways Technology Early College High School. Citing models from New York City and Chicago, Simpson and Sanfilip describe the schools where students graduate with two diplomas: a high school diploma and an associates degree in Information Technology (IT). The examples studied were also teamed with IBM, which provided employee volunteers as one-on-one mentors for students and, frequently, the promise of employment when students graduated. Although, Manual Academy currently does not have a similar corporate partner, we are hopeful to replicate that model.

Unlike traditional high school students, P-Tech students spend a significant amount of time during their upperclass years away from school participating in paid employment, attending community college classes, doing career-related volunteer work, apprenticeships or internships.

Our Manual Academy Action Team members are motivated and, most importantly, care deeply about the success of Manual Academy students.

The Peoria Public Schools Foundation hosts its 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Golf Outing at the Country Club of Peoria next Monday, June 26. This popular event includes a casual lunch, 18-holes of golf, dinner at the historic clubhouse, a silent auction and hole prizes including a chance to win a new car.

The golf portion of the event is fully booked with a record-breaking 144 golfers. Reservations are still available for the dinner portion of the day, featuring keynote speaker Andre Allen, Methodist College Coordinator of Student Life and Career Services, a graduate of Sterling Middle School and Richwoods High

School. Dinner guests can also bid on three Super-Sized Raffle Baskets containing gifts from dozens of local businesses.

Funds raised each year at the Golf Outing support the Foundation's Classroom and Field Trip Grants and student scholarships.

# Sun, Sand, and Cybersecurity

School's out and the beach and mountains are calling. It is that time of the year when so many of us pack our bags and hit the open road or head to the airport for a well-earned vacation. We may be ready to take a break from our normal lives, but we still need to be cyber secure while we are enjoying our time off! In this month's edition, we will explore some ways to be safe and smart with our devices, Internet usage, and social media while out travelling on vacation.

## **Stop-Think-Share**

Always be careful about how much you post on social media about your vacations before and during your travels. Criminals can and do watch online posts to find people that are on vacation because that means you have left your home unattended. Before "checking in" to a location on a social network, consider what else you are sharing – like the information that you aren't home. Consider skipping the "check in" and making your vacation posts after you have gotten back. This is another way people can see you aren't home. Perhaps this will have the double benefit of letting you take the time to choose only the best photos to post after your trip is over! At the very least, consider using privacy settings that only let friends see your posts. Additionally, consider turning off GPS and auto-tagging/auto-check in features, if you have them enabled.

## **Disable WiFi auto-connect services**

Some devices have an auto-connect feature that will search for and automatically connect to available and accessible WiFi networks without your interaction. This can allow your device to automatically connect to an unencrypted, public WiFi network, or even one that was set up by a malicious actor to eavesdrop on your browsing and connection activity.

If you want to connect to a store or hotel's network, check with an employee to see what the correct network is called, and see if they can provide a network password for a more secure, encrypted network. Always use a secure, encrypted network that requires login credentials if you have the option. In the event that isn't an option, and you can use your phone as a WiFi hotspot, use that instead to get a more secure connection for another device that can't make direct use of the cellular network's connection.

Additionally, make sure you do not choose to “remember this network” or “join this network automatically” once you have settled on a more trusted network for use during your vacation. If you have these settings switched on for a very generically named network, your device may connect you to a less secure one that happens to have the same name. Even if you have this turned off, there’s another setting that will automatically connect you to a network you have joined before, which can be a problem since your device doesn’t know the difference between your coffee shop’s “Guest” network and a malicious “Guest” network. Turn these settings off so you don’t automatically connect, and choose to connect only to more trusted, safer WiFi networks.

**Keep your devices close, and keep them locked when not in use!**

Whether it’s your laptop, tablet, or smartphone, be sure to keep your device on you or with someone you trust. Never leave a device unattended in an airport, train station, restaurant, hotel lobby or anywhere else in public while travelling. There is a common scam that targets people who leave devices sitting next to them. In this scam, another traveler will approach you and ask for help and then lay a newspaper or map down over your device. While you’re distracted answering their question, they are picking up and pocketing your device under the cover of the newspaper or map!

**Set a strong password:** Use at least 8 characters in upper and lower case, numbers, and symbols

**Set a strong pattern lock:** Use at least 7 points and double it back over itself with at least 2 turns
