Community Development Illinois Energy



On January 24, the Community Development Department co-hosted a day-long training session with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) on the 2015 Illinois Energy Conservation Code. The seminar was attended by approximately 100 builders, architects,

and other construction trades representatives. The focus was on the changes from the 2012 to the 2015 Energy Code. Per State law, the 2015 Energy Code must be observed in all developments.

Community Development—Wee Tee and Expo Development Meeting



On Monday, January 23, over 100 residents from Rolling Acres, Sherwood Forest, Richwood Knolls, and Willow Knolls neighborhood associations attended a meeting at Rolling Acres Middle School related to proposed developments at the Wee-Tee golf site, Expo Gardens, and Northmoor Road redevelopment. Mayor Ardis, Councilman Montelongo, and Councilman Ruckriegel were in attendance at the meeting along with staff from the Public Works and Community Development Departments.

A presentation was made by OSF staff related to a proposal to build an Almost Home Kids facility on the current Wee-Tee site. More information about Almost Home Kids can be found at this web site <http://www.almosthomekids.org/> A formal application has not been submitted for this project at this time. A public hearing before the City Planning & Zoning Commission and approval by the City Council would be required prior to any development occurring.

City staff reviewed information on the proposed redevelopment of Northmoor Road and the associated changes to the Expo Gardens property that fronts Northmoor Road. Several questions were raised about this project and a future public meeting to continue the conversation is anticipated.

Community Development—Peoria Kids Fest

The Community Development Department participated in the 10th Annual Peoria Kids Fest at the Peoria Civic Center on Saturday, January 21st. The family-focused community event offered fun and educational activities for the entire family. With the help of Raven the Recycler, Community Development staff

members interacted with children and their parents to promote the importance of community involvement. Over 1,000 "DON'T LITTER" pencils, toter pencil sharpeners, and educational material emphasizing the importance of a litter-free city were distributed.

On Thursday, January 19th, Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford County Health Departments held a Community Kick-Off event to release the Community Health Improvement Plan and to announce the community health priorities for the next three years. For the first time, the area health departments adopted a regional approach and selected priorities collectively through citizen participation. The priority areas are Behavioral Health, Healthy Eating-Active Living, Cancer, and Reproductive Health. The event also announced the reorganization of the Partnership for a Healthy Community, which will spearhead this collective process. The partnership encourages aligning around these four health priorities and incorporating Health in All Policies. Community Development—Campaign Signs

Political and/or Campaign signs are regulated by the City of Peoria Sign Ordinance. These signs are considered temporary and do not require an application or permit. However, there are specific performance standards that must be met.

1. In Residential zoning districts, the sign cannot exceed 8 square feet. In non-Residential zoning districts, the sign cannot exceed 32 square feet.
2. There is no limit on the number of signs that may be placed on an individual property.
3. Signs cannot be placed on the public right-of-way (generally the area between the sidewalk and street). This would also include attaching signs to stop signs, light poles, or other public infrastructure.

Peoria City/County Health Department--Every Smile Counts

Peoria - The Dentists of the Peoria District Dental Society and the OSF Dental Residency Program will be participating in the American Dental Association's "Give Kids A Smile" by providing dental services to many area underserved children. Routine services, including dental screenings, cleanings, and fluoride treatments by volunteer dentists, will be provided at Harrison School, 2727 W. Krause, Peoria, on Friday, February 3, 2017, from 8:30am - 11:30am. Children in need of urgent care will be referred for urgent care needs to Peoria City/County Health Department, 2116 N Sheridan Rd, Peoria.

Dr. Susan Bishop, Director at Peoria City/County Health Department Dental Clinic explains the need for these services at this one-day event. "Oral health is an underserved health issue in our area. In many children who do not have regular dental checkups, we see dental problems that cause pain and lost days at school, as well as lost hours at work for parents who need to take kids for emergency dental care. *Give Kids a Smile* is a terrific program that helps give volunteer dentists the opportunity to meet directly with kids and families to provide dental services and talk about dental care, including how to help prevent dental problems. Keeping kids healthy and pain free are the best reasons to *Give Kids A Smile*."

For children with no dental insurance or no dentist, call the Peoria District Dental Society at 309-444-4443 for a referral to one of the *Give Kids a Smile* event locations.

Dr. Bishop reminds everyone, "For good dental health, brush twice a day for two minutes with fluoride toothpaste, floss once a day, eat a balanced diet, no sugary drinks, drink water containing fluoride, and visit a dentist by age one and then regularly."

Peoria Public Schools—Update from Superintendent Desmoulin-Kherat

On Monday, I led Illinois Secretary of Education Susan Purvis, her colleague Sara Shaw, managing director of K-12 strategy, and State Senator Chuck Weaver on a tour of five Peoria Public Schools. The tour aimed to show some ways our District is meeting the diverse needs of our students.

Our first stop was Knoxville Center for Student Success (KCSS). As KCSS Principal Eric Thomas and I noted at KCSS' December graduation ceremony, the school's success illustrates that where education is concerned, one size does not fit all.

KCSS serves 128 high school students. These students face unusual and daunting life challenges, making



success at their traditional high school elusive. Many are parents and have other family responsibilities and jobs. Some have fallen behind academically due to behavior issues, illness or family hardship. Some simply have been unable to negotiate the large class sizes and relative anonymity of the District's larger high schools.

Through small class sizes, a nine-period school day, high teacher-student ratio and a combination of compassion, humor, discipline and tough love, KCSS staff give students a high level of personal attention and support to achieve graduation. The school has a no-cell-phone policy and conversation and behavior is carefully monitored. Fewer distractions allow students to earn missing credits at a rapid pace through traditional classroom and individual computer work.

This semester KCSS has extended its hours to help students earn high school credits. Previously, the school day ended at 2:30 p.m. Now, students can arrive as late as lunchtime and stay until 5:45 p.m. or can arrive at the customary 7:30 a.m. start and work through the longer school day. The three extra hours allow students with scheduling conflicts due to employment and childcare issues to work toward earning their



high school diploma. This year eight KCSS students also are enrolled in Woodruff Career and Technical Center (WCTC) programs, enabling them to graduate from high school with employment skills they can use immediately.

Extended school hours are another example of the services KCSS staff provides its unique student population. At times, staff members have helped homeless students find emergency housing, clothing and food vouchers. Students can receive individual counseling, small-group counseling, anger management and parenting classes to help them overcome obstacles to graduation. Community organizations including the Tri-county Urban League, fraternities, sororities and churches, provide tutoring, life skills training, college readiness and employment services. In fact, Senator Weaver who accompanied this week's tour is familiar with KCSS. Weaver and his wife, Laurie, have taught cooking classes to the school's students.

KCSS is a prime example of how the Peoria Public Schools are providing a world-class education for every student.

New Development at Bradley University

On Thursday, January 19th, representatives of Bradley University held a neighborhood meeting to share their plans for an exciting new major project at Bradley. Representatives of surrounding Neighborhood Associations attended the meeting to hear plans for a proposed Business and Engineering Complex.

The proposed new building will be located on the current sites of Baker and Jobst halls and will be the new home for the Foster College of Business and the Caterpillar College of Engineering and Technology, as well as the Center for Innovation through Collaboration.

The new 270,000 square foot, 5 story (4 stories above ground and 1 below ground) building is proposed to contain the following elements:

- ❖ 193 Offices
- ❖ 25 Classrooms
- ❖ 8 Computer Labs
- ❖ 46 Specialized Labs

Bradley University has designated a page on their web site to this project. More information is available at <http://www.bradley.edu/complexpreview>. The web site also provides the opportunity for the public to provide feedback and ask questions.

The proposed Business and Engineering complex requires an amendment to the Bradley University Official Development Plan and they anticipate submitting an application for the March 2, 2017 Planning and Zoning Commission Meeting.
