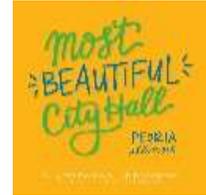

The following are issues related to the City for the weekly Issues Update. If there are additional items you believe should be included, please let me know.

**Community Development— Public Meeting Scheduled To Educate Potential Buyers of Properties Sold at the Peoria County Trustee Auction**

The Peoria County Trustee will hold an auction of properties acquired through the tax process system on Tuesday, August 7, 2018. The auction is held at 211 NE Adams at 6:00 PM. While this sale can provide citizens a chance to acquire a home, invest funds for rehab, and return property to tax rolls, sometimes the process can be daunting and the buyers need more information to make a home code compliant and livable.

In an effort to better inform potential buyers and concerned neighborhood residents, First District Councilwoman Denise Moore and the City of Peoria Community Development Department will host an informational community meeting on July 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. at the Carver Center, 710 W Percy Baker Jr Ave. Topics will include: permits, inspections, occupancy, and which repairs can be done by the purchaser versus a licensed contractor. Please note, it will not cover any questions regarding the auction.

City inspectors have completed a visual assessment of all auction properties and identified existing exterior code violations. Exterior photos and a brief summary of code violations for properties can be found at [PeoriaCodeViolations.com](http://PeoriaCodeViolations.com). Signs have also been placed on these properties noting the website.

In addition to correcting exterior violations, purchasers will be required to obtain a building permit for interior renovations. The interior work must be completed by licensed contractors. This includes, but is not limited to: electrical, plumbing, and HVAC systems.

It is not the intent of the Community Development Department to dissuade potential buyers of properties; rather, our goal is to provide vital information on the current condition of the houses available for sale and educate potential buyers on what will need to be completed before occupancy is allowed.

Working together with potential investors, future homeowners, and landlords allows the Community Development Department to reduce blight in neighborhoods, increase property values, and increase public safety. Residents of Peoria are encouraged to report potential code violations or unsafe structures to the Code Enforcement Division by using the Peoria Cares app, website, or by calling 309.494-CARE.

**Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**

This week students at Valeska Hinton Early Childhood Education Center (VHECEC) and Knoxville Center for Student Success (KCSS) return to school. Next Monday evening, KCSS students who take advantage of the center’s evening classes begin attending. It is wonderful that these “non-traditional” students, who often are juggling adult responsibilities of family-care and employment, are determined to earn their high school diplomas and that Peoria Public Schools can provide the means to do so. We intend for the Peoria Public School District to continue to move steadily toward this ideal – personalized education that fits the

needs of our students, their lives and the lives of their families, while preparing them for 21<sup>st</sup> century well-compensated professions.

We have many important events in the next few weeks, so here are some reminders:

PPS students who have not moved residences, and who are not required to have physical exams and immunizations, may register for the 2018-2019 school year online beginning Monday, July 23.

Families who are new to PPS, PPS families who have changed addresses and students entering pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, grade six, grade nine or grade 12, must register at one of the registration hubs. Three forms of proof-of-address are required.

The registration hub locations and times are:

- Tuesday, July 24, 8 a.m. – 6 p.m., at Kellar Primary School, Peoria High School, Harrison Community Learning Center and Glen Oak Community Learning Center
- Thursday, July 26, 8 a.m. – 6 p.m., at Kellar Primary School, Peoria High School, Harrison Community Learning Center and Glen Oak Community Learning Center
- Saturday, July 28, 9 a.m. – noon, at Dream Center Peoria (Backpack Peoria)
- Wednesday, August 1, 8 a.m. – 6 p.m., at Kellar Primary School, Peoria High School, Harrison Community Learning Center and Glen Oak Community Learning Center
- Saturday, August 4, 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., at Kellar Primary School, Peoria High School, Harrison Community Learning Center and Glen Oak Community Learning Center

All PPS students must have health requirements and immunizations up-to-date in order to start school on Wednesday, August 15. The Peoria City/County Health Department is now making appointments for immunizations. Their phone number is 309-679-6555. In addition, staff members from Heartland Community Clinic will be at the registration hubs to make appointments (often for the same day) for physical exams and immunizations.




### Year to Date % Chg - 2018 vs. the 5 Year Avg (2013-2017)







### Hate Crimes 2000-2017 Peoria Police Department






