Economic Development Startup In A Day – Business Navigation Tool

The City contracted the GPEDC to establish a business resource navigator through the Startup In A Day (SIAD) grant initiative from the National League of Cities. The GPEDC adopted www.gpsourcelink.com as a regional platform for business to navigate resources throughout the region. The platform was originally licensed by the Peoria County and now will be managed and updated by the GPEDC until the end of 2018.

The City's economic development department was awarded a \$50,000 grant in October of 2015 to make it easier for businesses to start their business. The initiative included: a) mapping the entrepreneurial ecosystem, b) establishing a business resource navigating platform, c) building a business mentorship program, d) assisting with minority business development, and d) streamlining the City's permitting process. The GPEDC was contracted to complete the first three items and the City to complete the remaining two items. To date, the minority business development initiative and the business resource navigating platform are completed.

The City of Peoria Community Development Department is holding a lottery for eligible homeowners for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) roof replacement program. What: Funding available for 20 roof replacements in the City of Peoria.

Who: Income qualified homeowners that meet all other eligibility requirements.

When: Lottery entrance begins Wednesday, February 21 at 8 am and ends Wednesday, March 7 at 5 pm. Entries may be made at any time during the entry period by completing an entry form.

Where: Entries may be made at City Hall Room 300 during regular business hours 8 am to 5 pm February 21 to March 7. Entries may also be made on February 21 from 5 to 6 pm. The lottery will be held on March 9 at 1 pm, but entrants do not need to be present.

Why: In order to continue revitalization efforts in the City of Peoria and prevent further deterioration of homes whose owners are unable to afford repairs.

Innovation Teams (i-teams) Help Shape West Main: What the Heck Is a Charrette?

The Innovation Team's work on West Main Street continues! The i-team has been working with students from both the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and Bradley University to bring fresh perspective and additional capacity to the Help Shape West Main initiative. This past Saturday, graduate students from the University of Illinois School of Architecture traveled to Peoria to gather feedback from those who live, work, and play on West Main. The students spent the past four weeks getting to know the corridor from a data driven perspective. They analyzed information ranging from how much light there is in the corridor at different times of day to how much space exists between buildings and the sidewalk. Saturday morning was spent presenting this information and gathering additional feedback from firsthand users of the street. Called a "charrette" in the design world, participants spent time marking up maps and sketching out ideas for the students to take with them to incorporate into their work.



From addressing what the corridor needs to make it feel more comfortable, to designing programs that will draw people back to the street, the students will return to Peoria on April 27th to showcase their final projects. Stay tuned for more details! Thank you to Associate Professor Sara Bartumeus with the University of Illinois School of Architecture and Kathy Brown with the University of Illinois Extension for your contributions to the Help Shape West Main initiative! Peoria Public Schools Observe Black History Month

Peoria Public Schools staff and students, particularly at our high schools, dedicate considerable time, energy and creativity to Black History Month celebrations.

Manual Academy held a Family Dinner Theatre on Wednesday, February 21. The evening opened with Walk-Through History Displays. During dinner, guests watched student performances.

The Manual Academy community also has enjoyed a Soul Cinema Film Festival each Tuesday and Thursday after school this month featuring films such as The Great Debaters, Dream Girls, The Pursuit of Happyness and many more. Guidance counselor Myskeshia L. Mitchell coordinated the month's events.

At Richwoods High School, students involved in the Minority Academic Advancement Project (MAPP) coordinate and promote the school's Black History celebration. The theme this year is 90s television, with daily trivia, a spirit week, 90s music and an assembly written and performed by students.

Peoria High School students are observing Black History Month with "Mic Drop," every Thursday during 6th period in February.
