The updated Thoroughfare Plan will include the revised specification for public streets that have occurred since 2002.



### **Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**



Next Thursday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, Peoria Public Schools will host the first Parent University of the 2019-2020 year – Books and Barbecue – from 5 – 8 p.m. at the Peoria Park District Noble Center and the Peoria Public Library Lakeview branch.

Parent University, held twice each school year, gives Peoria Public School families the opportunity to spend quality time together and explore various Peoria cultural and entertainment attractions. This year's Parent University activities are part of

the district's focus on reading and literacy.

Entertainment for the evening includes story time and crafts at the library and inflatable slides and bouncers on the lawn and in the Lakeview Recreation Center.

Presentations from Peoria Public Schools staff about Crisis Go, the Wraparound Center, K-4 athletics, and the Waterford reading program will be held throughout the evening.

Free dinner will be served in the Noble Center and hot chocolate will be available near the library. Parents and children can learn to prepare healthy snacks and meals at Sodexo Food Service's popular Snack-A-Demics program, also located in the Noble Center.

The Lakeview library computer stations will be available for high school seniors and their families to complete their FAFSA application.




## Peoria Cares Communication Transactions During the Month of August 2019



In August, a total of 1,174 calls were received from the Peoria Cares phone line. There were 314 phone calls that generated a Peoria Cares case and 95 phone calls that produced service requests. The cases were sent to the appropriate City Department(s). Each department handled the complaint from start to finish. Every call will always receive an optimum level of customer service; during this time period, there were calls that varied in response. In addition, some of the Peoria Cares phone calls required, research and information gathering for other assistance and services offered, in the Greater Peoria Tri-County Communities.




## Peoria Cares August 2019 Complaints by Category
