

Former Resident and Academy Award Winner to Be Honored with Street Naming

Tami Lane, the only Peorian to receive an Academy Award, will be honored with an honorary street naming on Thursday, September 9. A brief program will be held at 10:30 a.m., in front of Hines Primary School, where Ms. Lane attended elementary school. Speakers at the event include Third District Councilman Tim Rigggenbach, Peoria Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat, Principal Marcia Lough, and Roger Monroe as the emcee.

Ms. Lane, the daughter of Roger and Linda Lane, was born, raised, and educated in Peoria the daughter of Roger and Linda Lane. Ms. Lane, along with Howard Berger, won the 2006 Academy Award for Best Makeup in the movie, "The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe." In 2013, Lane, along with two colleagues, was nominated for another Academy Award for Makeup, for "The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey."

As an accomplished and highly recognized prosthetic makeup artist, she has traveled all over the world working on "The Lord of the Rings," "The Hobbit" "Destroyer," "Spenser Confidential," "Splice," "Water for Elephants," "Fright Night," and many other films and television programs.

A graduate of Hines Primary School, Woodruff High School, and Bradley University, she was recruited to the latter where she played softball. Her love of softball and baseball came from her late father, Roger Lane, a well-known and highly respected former head baseball coach at Woodruff High School for over 30 years. In 1996, she received a Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Art and a focus on Graphic Design. After meeting well-known prosthetic artists Howard Berger and Greg Nicotero during a tour of their special effects makeup studio in Los Angeles, Ms. Lane returned to Peoria and with some classmates, hooked her car up with a U-Haul truck, and moved to California. It took some persistence, but she finally convinced Berger to hire her at his company, KNB-EFX Group, Inc. Peoria is proud of the amazing achievements of Tami Lane and recognizes her with the Honorary Naming of Lyndale Road as "Tami Lane," a street she walked many times as a child while attending Hines Primary School.

Community Development-2022 ESG Application Open

The application period for 2022-2023 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding will open at 8:00 AM on Tuesday, September 7th and close at 5:00 PM on Wednesday, October 13th. The city of Peoria receives ESG funding each year from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Funding must be used to provide services to individuals experiencing homelessness in eligible programs including emergency shelter operations and rapid rehousing. Eligible applications will be reviewed by the Home For All Continuum of Care Governing Board and agencies will be notified of funding decisions following City Council approval. Funding will be awarded for two years.

This summary document is produced on a weekly basis. It is used as an agenda for the City Development Review Board and as a transparency tool to allow the public to be aware of development in Peoria.

1. Summary Information

- **One Stop Shop** is held every Monday at 1:30 PM in City Hall. This is a free service for anyone who wants to discuss development with staff from various City departments, local utility companies, the Health Department, and CityLink.
- **Development Center Permits** can typically be issued immediately and/or do not require an extensive review period. These permits include most trade (electrical, plumbing, HVAC, etc.) permits, repair permits, new single-family residential construction, alteration/additions, and demolitions.
- Each permit application includes a self-reported value of the project. The **Total Value of Development (YTD)** is the sum of these reported values.

2. Development Review Board Projects

- The **Development Review Board** is a group of City staff, local utility representatives, and other local government agencies that review and comment on more complex development applications and cases that are required to go to a public hearing.
- A **Job** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance but does not require a public hearing or City Council review.
- A **Project** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance and requires a public hearing before a City Commission and in some cases, a final decision by the City Council.
- The **Staff Assigned** to each Job or Project is the primary contact person for any inquires.
