

PeoriaCorps Hosts Two Graduation Ceremonies



On September 23, PeoriaCorps hosted two graduation ceremonies for the participants of their fifth and sixth cohorts. Held at Luthy Botanical Garden, the graduation provided the opportunity to celebrate the many accomplishments of both groups.

The fifth cohort, comprised of seven graduates, concluded in December of 2020. During their tenure with the program, they organized two community service days at the Friendship House and removed litter and debris from 63 acres of right of way and public roads throughout the City. Members in this cohort had many successes, including graduating with the NGICP certificate for green infrastructure, accepting full time positions, and returning to school.

Six people graduated from the sixth cohort with many earning full time work or returning to school. Projects from this group included, working with young people from the DREAM2 program at The Proctor Center, maintaining 700 native plants in the Well Farm at Voris Field bioswale, working in community gardens, assisting with a controlled burn at Riverfront Park.

Launched in July 2017, the PeoriaCorps program aimed to provide career track and educational opportunities for unemployed workers 18 years and older. Corps members gained skills in environmental beautification & stewardship and green landscaping solutions. Members also received classroom training in soft skills, vital to the career building process. For the past six months they've worked on green infrastructure projects that included planting trees, harvesting and planting native plants, and maintaining green infrastructure practices around the city of Peoria. Corps members also earned credentials from the National Green Infrastructure Certification Program.

This summary document is produced on a weekly basis. It is used as an agenda for the City Development Review Board and as a transparency tool to allow the public to be aware of development in Peoria.

1. Summary Information

- **One Stop Shop** is held every Monday at 1:30 PM in City Hall. This is a free service for anyone who wants to discuss development with staff from various City departments, local utility companies, the Health Department, and CityLink.
- **Development Center Permits** can typically be issued immediately and/or do not require an extensive review period. These permits include most trade (electrical, plumbing, HVAC, etc.) permits, repair permits, new single-family residential construction, alteration/additions, and demolitions.
- Each permit application includes a self-reported value of the project. The **Total Value of Development (YTD)** is the sum of these reported values.

2. Development Review Board Projects

- The **Development Review Board** is a group of City staff, local utility representatives, and other local government agencies that review and comment on more complex development applications and cases that are required to go to a public hearing.
- A **Job** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance but does not require a public hearing or City Council review.
- A **Project** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance and requires a public hearing before a City Commission and in some cases, a final decision by the City Council.
- The **Staff Assigned** to each Job or Project is the primary contact person for any inquires.
