



**COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments Available for Ages 5-11 Starting November 9**



The Peoria City/County Health Department is now taking COVID-19 vaccine appointments for children ages 5-11 on November 9 and 11. Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and have an appointment.

On October 29, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration expanded the emergency use authorization of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine. On November 2, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommended children ages 5-11 receive the vaccine, which the Illinois Department of Public Health adopted the next day.

Walk-ins are still welcome for ages 12+ at the Peoria City/County Health Department, Monday-Friday, 8 am-4 pm. Currently, walk-ins are not accepted for ages 5-11 due to the limited supply.

The Peoria City/County Health Department is located at 2116 N Sheridan Road, Peoria, IL.

**Boosters**

COVID-19 booster shots are available without an appointment at the Peoria City/County Health Department, Monday-Friday, from 8 am-4 pm.

The CDC recommends the same product that was used for the primary vaccination should be used for the booster, although boosting with a single dose of any authorized COVID-19 vaccine booster is acceptable (called "mix and match").

Individuals age 18+ who received Johnson & Johnson at least two months ago are eligible to receive a booster dose.

Individuals 18+ who completed their two-dose series of Pfizer and Moderna most have completed their series at least six months ago and meet one of the following criteria to be eligible to receive a booster:

- Age 65+
- Age 18+, living in a long-term care setting
- Age 18+, with an underlying medical condition
- Age 18+, working in a high-risk setting
- Age 18+, living in a high-risk setting

### **Peoria Police Department—Promotions**



Congratulations to Brock Lavin and Steven Melton. These two outstanding police officers were promoted Monday, November 1, 2021 to the rank of Lieutenant and Sergeant.

Lt. Brock Lavin started his career with the Peoria Police Department in May of 2006. During his years on the force, Lt. Lavin has worked in several police units that includes: The Special Response Team (SRT), Violent Crimes Task Force, Patrol, Special Investigations (S.I.D), and most recently as a Field Training Sergeant.

Sgt. Steven Melton started with the Peoria Police Department in January of 2013. He has worked in

Patrol his entire career. Melton served as a Field Training Officer (FTO) and a Mobile Field Force Instructor. Melton says he is determined to move forward in his career with PPD and help make the City of Peoria a better place for everyone.

### **Peoria Police Department Signs 10 Shared Principles on Building Trust in Communities of Color**

On Tuesday, November 2, 2021, Peoria Police Chief, Eric Echevarria and the Peoria NAACP signed the 10 Shared Principles on Building Trust in communities of color.

Those 10 Shared Principles are as follows:

1. We value the life of every person and consider life to be of the highest value.

2. All persons should be treated with dignity and respect.

3. We reject discrimination toward any person that is based on race, ethnicity, religion, color, nationality, immigrant status, sexual orientation, gender, disability, or familial status.

4. We endorse the six pillars in the report of President Obama's Task Force on 21st Century Policing. The first pillar is to build and rebuild trust through procedural justice, transparency, accountability, and honest recognition of past and present obstacles.

5. We endorse the four pillars of procedural justice, which are fairness, voice, transparency, and impartiality.


6. We endorse the values

inherent in community policing, which includes community partnerships involving law enforcement, engagement of police officers with residents outside of interaction specific to enforcement of laws, and problem solving that is collaborative, not one sided.

7. We believe that developing strong ongoing relationships between law enforcement and communities of color at the leadership level and street level will be the keys to diminishing and eliminating racial tension.

8. We believe that law enforcement and community leaders have a mutual responsibility to encourage all citizens to gain a better understanding and knowledge of the law to assist them in their interactions with law enforcement officers.

9. We support diversity in police departments and in the law enforcement profession. Law enforcement and communities have a mutual responsibility and should work together to make a concerted effort to recruit diverse police departments.



10. We believe de-escalation training should be required to ensure the safety of community members and officers. We endorse using de-escalation tactics to reduce the potential for confrontations that endanger law enforcement officers and community members; and the principle that human life should be taken only as a last resort.

The Peoria Police Department’s Cops & Candy drive-thru event, held on Friday, October 29, 2021, was a HUGE success! Over 4,000 pieces of candy were handed out to the boys and girls who braved the cold and the rain.



**Peoria Public Schools – Update from Superintendent Dr. Sharon Desmoulin-Kherat**

In partnership with UnityPoint Health, Peoria Public Schools' in-school health provider, we are planning to bring the vaccines directly to our schools for those families who want their 5-11 year old to be vaccinated.

UnityPoint will go to schools to administer the vaccine **starting Monday, November 8.**

This week, every child in the 5-11 age group in PPS has received a COVID-19 vaccine consent form. If you would like your student to receive the vaccine at school by a UnityPoint Health provider, please turn in the completed consent form to the school office.

Once the consent form is sent to the UnityPoint nurses, an appointment will be scheduled at the school. A UnityPoint representative will also contact the parent to confirm the details and inform the parent on time in case they want to be present at the school when the vaccine is administered.

The vaccine is not mandated – however, we highly encourage that our families seek it out for their children. So far this school year, the vast majority of positive COVID cases have occurred in this age group. Together, we can bring this pandemic to a close and continue safe in-person instruction this school year.

# WEEKLY DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

## CITY OF PEORIA – COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

**Date: 11/03/2021**

This summary document is produced on a weekly basis. It is used as an agenda for the City Development Review Board and as a transparency tool to allow the public to be aware of development in Peoria.

### 1. Summary Information

- **One Stop Shop** is held every Monday at 1:30 PM in City Hall. This is a free service for anyone who wants to discuss development with staff from various City departments, local utility companies, the Health Department, and CityLink.
- **Development Center Permits** can typically be issued immediately and/or do not require an extensive review period. These permits include most trade (electrical, plumbing, HVAC, etc.) permits, repair permits, new single-family residential construction, alteration/additions, and demolitions.
- Each permit application includes a self-reported value of the project. The **Total Value of Development (YTD)** is the sum of these reported values.

### 2. Development Review Board Projects

- The **Development Review Board** is a group of City staff, local utility representatives, and other local government agencies that review and comment on more complex development applications and cases that are required to go to a public hearing.
- A **Job** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance but does not require a public hearing or City Council review.
- A **Project** is a development application that requires multiple departments to review for compliance and requires a public hearing before a City Commission and in some cases, a final decision by the City Council.
- The **Staff Assigned** to each Job or Project is the primary contact person for any inquires.
