**Peoria 2023 is here!**

**City of Peoria Schedules Strategic Planning Kickoff Events on June 1-2**

In preparation to develop Peoria's five-year strategic plan, the city of Peoria is inviting the community to Strategic Planning Kickoff Events scheduled for Thursday, June 1, and Friday, June 2 in the Peoria Civic Center Ballroom, located at 201 SW Jefferson Avenue. Parking will be free in the Marquee and Madison Street lots until 4 pm on both days.

There will be two sessions per day with a morning session from 9 a.m. to noon, and an afternoon session from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. The public is asked to select one session on Thursday and one session on Friday. Please RSVP on the [City's website](#) by Friday, May 26, 2023, by the close of business to confirm attendance.

Mayor Ali encouraged the public to attend the kick-off stating, "The success of our strategic planning lies in robust public input. Community members are encouraged to attend, to voice their thoughts, and contribute to the future of our city."

The goal of the Strategic Planning Kickoff is to begin a process to establish the priorities of the city over the next two to five years with a two-day event that includes informational presentations and community dialogue about our future. This event is open to all Peoria residents, community/business leaders, commissioners, elected officials, employees, and other stakeholders.

The kickoff will focus on the critical issues facing our community and allow attendees to identify collaborative responses. These events will address topics including city-wide economic development, downtown vibrancy, neighborhood development, infrastructure, and the future fiscal health of the city. The sessions will also explore the public safety ecosystems, integration of diversity, equity, and inclusion within the focus areas, along with preserving, supporting, and expanding arts and culture opportunities within the city.

DCEO's Office of Broadband and the University of Illinois will be inviting residents and local organizations in Central Illinois to a series of in-person listening sessions regarding broadband expansion. The events will give the public and local government leaders a forum for asking questions and providing input about the region's most urgent needs and priorities related to high-speed internet connectivity and access. People also can participate in information sessions and listening sessions by going to <https://broadband.uillinois.edu/>

The community events are one way that Illinois residents can contribute to the state's plan to invest federal funding from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act's (IIJA) Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) and Digital Equity (DE) programs. With this federal funding, we have a generational opportunity to close the digital divide in Illinois. Local residents know better than anyone what the needs are, where the gaps are, and how internet access, computing devices, and related skills can impact their day-to-day lives.

While book bans and challenges are surging in states across the country, Illinois passed historic legislation on Wednesday, May 3 that protects our [#FreedomtoRead](#) by tying state funding of libraries (public and public school) to policies that explicitly prevent book banning.

We were honored to be part of the proceedings, along with [Fondulac District Library](#), at the invitation of Illinois Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias, who also serves as the state's head librarian.

At the Statehouse press conference, Peoria Public Library Executive Director Randall Yelverton discussed how our Central Illinois Reads coalition, which includes seven libraries and three community organizations, is shining a light on the importance of choice.

Illinois Gov. Pritzker, who addressed book bans head-on in his State of the State address, is expected to sign this bill.
