Yard Waste, Recycling, and Trash Customer Satisfaction Survey Available to Peoria Residents

A recycling, yard waste, and trash customer [satisfaction survey](#) for the city of Peoria’s hauler, GFL, is currently available for residents.

The survey seeks to gather residents’ satisfaction with the solid waste services provided by the City. The survey is available to all city of Peoria residents who use GFL’s services. The survey is accessible on the [Peoria Picks Up](#) and the [City of Peoria’s](#) websites.

Residents are encouraged to participate by responding to the questionnaire with feedback on current solid waste services. The results from the customer satisfaction survey will be used to improve current and future collection contracts.



The Department of Public Works and Bradley University, with the support of the city’s solid waste consultant Foth Infrastructure & Environment, LLC, are conducting the customer survey. The [survey](#) will remain open through the end of the year.

Rededication Event Held for Preston Jackson Sculpture ‘Fight of the Cakewalkers’

The city of Peoria held a rededication event on the riverfront today for one of Preston Jackson’s sculptures in Liberty Park, located in the 300 block of SW Water Street. “Flight of the Cakewalkers”, a painted steel and cast bronze sculpture, now newly restored, was rededicated to Steve Shostrom, an advocate for Peoria and the riverfront, by his wife, Joy Kessler. Speakers at the event included Mayor Ali, Emily Cahill, Executive Director of Peoria Park District, and Kessler.

“Flight of the Cakewalkers” was created by internationally recognized artist Preston Jackson in 2001 and first exhibited at Navy Pier in Chicago. Following that, it was installed on the riverfront. From his studio, "Flight of the Cakewalkers represents the victories and struggles of all people throughout our history who have felt at one time they were excluded from the mainstream. Many symbols adorn this work. There is the representation of strong womanhood in the form of a single face, which represents people such as Ida B. Wells and Mary Church Terrell. There is the sign of the two-headed poisonous snake, moving both North and South. There is the symbol of the family as the couple jumps over the wedding broom. And most of all, there is the large plantation house that represents the exploitation of the labor of those who had no control over their lives.” Jackson’s work has been exhibited throughout the United States, and he was named the Laureate of the Lincoln Academy of Illinois, receiving the Order of Lincoln Medallion in 1998. His sculpture, “Bronzeville to Harlem: An American Story,” is on permanent display at the Peoria Riverfront Museum.



Peoria resident Joy Kessler sponsored the restoration of the piece in honor of the work of her husband, Steve Shostrom. Shostrom is well known in Peoria for his work with the running community and as a founding member of both the Peoria Area Sports Commission and Moonlight Basketball League. A champion of developing Peoria’s riverfront since the early 1980s, he is

equally respected for his work with the Peoria Park District, as a member of the Peoria Park District Recreation Committee.

In reflecting on the rededication, Kessler stated, “Although my husband, Steve Shostrom, is best known for being the co-founder of the Illinois Valley Striders and the Steamboat Classic, he has always had a great love for the Peoria riverfront. He was very involved in the creation of the first Riverfront Sculpture Walk along the Illinois River, and he has always strongly encouraged the riverfront to be used for recreation and the arts.” She continued, “So it is fitting that this sculpture be rededicated in his name, in the hopes that the riverfront will continue to develop and become the crowning jewel of downtown Peoria.”

Community Development – 2025 CDBG Public Services Application Available Aug. 5–Aug. 30

The city of Peoria is accepting applications from not-for-profits, 501(c)3 organizations, and government agencies for 2025 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Services funding from Monday, Aug. 5, through Friday, Aug. 30.

The city of Peoria receives CDBG funding each year from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Up to 15% of the city’s annual funding amount can be granted to agencies for programs that serve low and moderate-income persons. Each organization is limited to one application with a maximum award of \$30,000.

Community Development – City of Peoria Launches East Village Growth Cell TIF Garage Demolition Program

On Tuesday, May 7, the City of Peoria launched the East Village Growth Cell TIF Garage Demolition Program. This program helps to demolish and remove unsafe, detached garages within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF.

The program is open only to homeowners for the first 60 days. On Monday, July 8, the program will be open to all properties within the boundary of the East Village Growth Cell TIF.

To qualify, applicants:

- Must own the property and have proof of homeowners insurance
- Cannot owe the city any money
- Must be current on property taxes
- Must have a detached garage in unsafe or unusable condition
- Must have a habitable house on the lot where the garage is being demolished

How to Apply

Applications for the East Village Growth Cell TIF Garage Demolition Program will be accepted until all funds are exhausted.

Peoria Fire Department Chosen for Beta Testing new Incident Reporting System

The Peoria Fire Department has been selected as one of 50 beta testing sites for implementation of a new national incident reporting system.

The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) is leading a national effort to develop and launch a new interoperable fire information and innovative analytics platform called the National Emergency Response Information System (NERIS). It will be a new form of national incident reporting for fire departments across the nation and will replace the antiquated National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) currently in place.

Division Chief Nate Rice submitted an application in July to help PFD help modernize its emergency response capabilities, and the department was chosen a month later.

Peoria Fire Department Promotes Fire Prevention at Illinois State Fair

Three members of the Peoria Fire Department recently represented the department at the Illinois State Fair, where they assisted in the State Fire Marshal tent. The PFD members helped bring attention to fire prevention, and children were able to get hands-on experience with activities, including sliding down a fire pole.



Fire Prevention month runs through the month

of October and is an opportunity for the Prevention department to demonstrate the importance of smoke detectors and spread awareness of fire prevention.

Peoria Public Works – Jefferson/Adams Conversion Update

Sidewalk work at the intersection of Hamilton Boulevard and NE Adams Street is nearing completion. The sidewalks near 201 NE Adams Street will reopen to pedestrian access soon.

Sidewalk work continues at the intersections of Fulton Plaza and SW Adams Street. The sidewalks near 123 and 201 SW Adams Street have limited pedestrian access. Sidewalk work also continues at the intersection of Main Street and NE Adams Street. Sidewalks near 100 NE Adams Street remain closed to pedestrian access.

Sidewalk removal work will begin at the intersection of Hamilton Boulevard and NE Adams Street, near the Peoria County Courthouse, in the coming weeks.

Pedestrians should continue to use caution near these closures and cross the street at the next available intersection. As a reminder, the design of the ADA sidewalk ramps at the completed intersections has changed. Pedestrians should be mindful of the new design at the finished intersections.

Lane and parking restrictions remain in effect along SW Adams Street. On-street parking restrictions are marked. Drivers should look for unbagged, available parking meters for on-street parking. **If parking meters are bagged with “No Parking” signs, drivers should not park at those spots. Parking at bagged parking meters will result in a ticket and vehicle removal at the owner’s expense.**

This summary document is produced on a weekly basis. It is used as an agenda for the City Development Review Board and as a transparency tool to allow the public to be aware of development in Peoria.

1. Summary Information

- **One Stop Shop** is held every Monday at 1:30 PM virtually. This is a free service for anyone who wants to discuss development with staff from various City departments, local utility companies, the Health Department, and CityLink.
- **Development Center Permits** can typically be issued immediately and/or do not require an extensive review period. These permits include most trade (electrical, plumbing, HVAC, etc.) permits, repair permits, new single-family residential construction, alteration/additions, and demolitions.
- Each permit application includes a self-reported value of the project. The **Total Value of Development (YTD)** is the sum of these reported values.

2. Development Review Board Projects

- The **Development Review Board** is a group of City staff, local utility representatives, and other local government agencies that review and comment on more complex development applications and cases that are required to go to a public hearing.
- Items listed below with the prefixes HPC, PZC or ZBA in the first column are considered **Plans**. **Plans** are development applications that require multiple departments to review for compliance and include a public hearing before a City Commission; in some cases, **Plans** may also require a final decision by the City Council.
- All other items listed below are **Building Permits**. **Building Permits** are development applications that require multiple departments to review for compliance but do not require a public hearing or City Council review.
- The **Staff Assigned** to each item is the primary contact person for any inquiries.


